## From Your Pastor

The Lord be with you, beloved in Christ.

With roughly a month of the school year under our belts, you can't walk down the halls of Elm Grove Ev. Lutheran Church's mission, her day school, without seeing or hearing some reference to success. We are after all training the children for success: to be successful in academics, sports, relationships, conduct. You name the area, and we want our children to be successful. We often equate winning with success. If the Packers win the division, it was a fairly successful year. If they win the Super Bowl, it was an amazingly successful year. Simply put, if you win, you're a success. If you lose, you're a failure. Nothing else matters. That's the way it is in the world - in sports, in business, in everything.

That's why we have a difficult time with the Church. For the Church is never called to success, but to faithfulness. She is to remain faithful to her Lord. And she does that as she uses what He has given her to use - His Word, His Ministry, and His Sacraments of Baptism, Absolution, and Communion. In the same way He has given to His Bride a wonderful setting in which to receive these gifts: the Divine Service. In fact, the Liturgy itself serves the Gospel as it is drawn from Scripture, rightly divides Law and Gospel, and delivers the bounty of Jesus' sacrificial death: forgiveness of sins, life, and salvation. It also unites us with the Church of the past and the Church in heaven.

We also see the stark contrast between success and faithfulness in the life of our Lord Jesus, especially during Holy Week. Throughout His life He remained completely faithful to His Father, even when it meant being nailed to a cross, lifted up to suffer and die. Nothing could stop Him from doing all that His Father had given Him to do for our salvation. Certainly, on Good Friday, as He hung on the cross, bleeding, gasping for each breath, dying, He seemed to be the ultimate failure. All but a few friends had abandoned Him, even most of His handpicked disciples. His fame from the previous Sunday had all but vanished. The crowds which praised Him on Palm Sunday are now gone, disillusioned. *"This one can't be the Messiah, though we were hoping He was. And who wants to follow someone who is crucified. How could we have been so foolish?"*

And yet, this was not the first time Jesus would be considered to be a failure. Just after He confesses that He is the very "Bread of Life", we hear, **"many of his disciples turned back and no longer walked with him."** (John 6:66). And when Jesus asked the Twelve if they wanted to leave too, Peter answered, **"Lord, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life, and we have believed, and have come to know, that you are the Holy One of God."** (John 6:68-69).


Then on Easter, when Jesus rose from the dead, He re-

mained faithful to His Father and to His Word. He had told the disciples at least three times that He would be killed and on the third day rise again. So when His disciples saw their resurrected Lord, they were filled with divine joy. By God's grace alone they were forgiven and restored and rejoiced with the risen Lord.

Then, as those disciples faithfully went out to preach and teach the Gospel of Jesus Christ, they too often appeared to be complete failures. They suffered much for the cause of the Gospel and most of them were killed for their efforts. They weren't successful according to earthly standards, but, by God's grace and mercy alone, they were faithful to their Lord. And the same is true today as God's people are persecuted, and even killed, for being faithful to Christ.

Let us then, be faithful, and make that our heart's greatest desire. Let us seek and attend the Divine Service, for it faithfully delivers all the gifts our Lord desires us to receive. May we treasure and sing the liturgy which serves to deliver our Lord's gifts. Faithfully, week-in-and week-out, receiving what He has given to us that we may grow in faith and love. Faithfully giving to support the work He has set before us.

Believe me; we will not always succeed according to the world's perspective, but as we live by and in His grace, let us strive to do all things well - in our personal lives and as a congregation. And as we so strive, as we faithfully receive His gifts in the Divine Service, as we learn evermore to trust in the Lord Jesus alone, God will work in us such faithfulness that will lead to eternal life. And that is the only eternal success that really matters.




# CATECHESIS

It seems like a big scary word, but it's not. It comes to us from the Greek meaning "to echo," as in to repeat back. In the context of the Church, catechesis is the life-long process of allowing the Word of God to speak to us, to convict us of our sins, to regenerate us in the forgiveness of sins, to strengthen and educate us in the Christian faith that has been handed down to us from the beginning. Through ongoing catechesis we learn what God thinks is central to our life and faith. We hear this Word read and preached, sung and prayed in regular worship, but also through intentional study of His Word in private devotions and in public Bible studies. In these ways the Holy Spirit applies God's Law and Gospel to our individual lives.

In a very real sense we are being catechized all the time. No one is a neutral player on the world's stage. The question is simply, from whom are we learning? Are we primarily learning from the unbelieving world to adopt and integrate its values and worldview or are we primarily learning from God, adopting His values and worldview? Your church thinks you are valuable and wants to make sure that you are prepared for the challenges that face you in your various vocations. To that end, the Sunday morning adult Bible study time will be called STS – Short Topical Studies. The STS will vary in length, on average 4-6 weeks, allowing us time to delve into the Scriptural basis and then to make the application to our lives.

The first STS is on Abortion and began Sunday, September 22, led by Pastor Skovgaard. We will meet in the Music Center (124), unless high attendance dictates that we move to the nave. This first STS will include Karen Clark's High School youth class.

In addition to this regular Sunday morning class, note these other opportunities for catechesis:

A **Key-to-Life** class, led by Pastor Peters, will run continuously in the Conference Room (228) on Sunday mornings for those adults interested in membership at Elm Grove Ev. Lutheran Church. The **youth confirmation class** will take place from 12:30-2:00 on Sundays in the Conference Room on the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> Sundays of the month. Meanwhile the midweek studies continue also. The **Tuesday Ladies Bible Study**, which meets from 10:00-11:00 in the Bartelt Center, is making its way through the Book of Revelation, and the **Wednesday Ladies Bible Study**, which meets from 10:00-11:00 in the Conference Room, is making its way through the Smalcald Articles and the Treatise on the Power and Primacy of the Pope. The **Thursday Morning Men's Bible Study**, which meets from 6:30-7:30 in the Conference Room, is finishing up the Gospel of Luke in the month of October.

Periodically, over the next few months, we place in front of you those whom you have elected as officers to serve and lead on the six constitutionally mandated boards. All of the boards meet eleven times a year but members also

give of their time to prepare for these meetings by serving on various committees within each board. 
