From Your Pastor

As I put finger to keyboard right now, everyone's attention is on COVID-19 [which means the Coronavirus Disease identified in 2019] and the nation's response to it. Consequently, it may seem like an unwelcome guest at a party to talk about repentance, even now in the season of Lent, but I suggest to you today that this a perfectly good time to remember the importance of repentance in the Christian life. I do not mean to imply that those who get sick are guilty of some specific sin for which they should repent.

What I do mean to say, however, is that in this current pandemic (there will be others), we see a crucial Biblical teaching at work. Whether it's war, famine, or pestilence [think of the horsemen of Revelation 6], the brokenness, fear, and anxiety we see all around us are directly connected to mankind's fall into sin and our ongoing sin. Yes, we are to blame. God in His mercy provides us with wise government leaders and dedicated medical staff and researchers to alleviate some of the bite of sin, for which we ought to always give thanks, but pandemics ravage us precisely as the consequence of our rebellion against God. Now is a perfect time to recognize your sin, own it, repent of it, and cling to Christ for forgiveness.

The theme of repentance is closely connected with Lent and for good reason. Consider some of the lessons from holy Scripture that we typically hear in worship during Lent. Simply looking at the Gospel readings we remember some important lessons. When Jesus was tempted in the desert, He overcame the temptations that our forefathers, the Israelites, gave in to – the demands of our bellies, the lust for power, and the allure of false worship. As Palm Sunday draws nearer, Jesus mourns over Jerusalem, the city which kills the prophets – the very ones God sends to warn His people of the coming judgment. Then we heard how important it is that we not think more highly of ourselves than we ought, but repent before calamity (like the Tower of Siloam) comes upon us. Nor should we consider the Lord's vineyard our own private property for us to misuse, and thus reject Jesus, whom God sends as the rightful owner to extract the fruit of repentance from us, His tenants.


Dietrich Bonhoeffer describes the need for repentance well in his book, *The Cost of Discipleship*. "Cheap grace means the justification of sin without the justification of the sinner. Grace alone does everything, they say, and so everything can remain as it was before...Cheap grace is the preaching of forgiveness without requiring repentance, baptism without church discipline, communion without confession, absolution without personal confession. Cheap grace is grace without discipleship, grace without the cross, grace without Jesus Christ, living and incarnate."

Repentance is at the heart of our lives as God's people. It opens the door to God's kingdom. The tax collectors and sinners of Jesus' day were going in because they repented and found mercy and forgiveness in the message of Jesus, the Son of God made flesh for the salvation of the world. The Pharisees, on the other hand – and all those who reject their need for salvation whether through aggressive atheism or benign neglect – are left on the outside. Thank God that Jesus does habitually welcome sinners, because that is what we are. He took what we deserved upon Himself so that we might receive His forgiveness. He still comes to call sinners to repentance. The invitation is unwavering and constant.


St. John tells us in his Gospel that "when He [the Holy Spirit] comes, He will convict the world of guilt in regard to sin" (John 16:8). Part of the Spirit's work is to lead us into repentance. Consequently, we can describe repentance as the first fruit of the Spirit's work. Is it any surprise that Luther's first thesis among the 95 which kick started the Reformation was on the importance of repenting, of turning from sin, to the forgiveness of Christ? "When our Lord and Master Jesus Christ said, "Repent" (Matt 4:17), he willed the entire life of believers to be one of repentance."

Now, the point of highlighting the theme of Lent one last time right before we enter the season of Easter is to make sure we do not miss what is accomplished for us in the resurrection of Jesus. In His life, death, and resurrection Jesus wins the victory for us over our ancient enemies of sin, death, and the devil. Christ has crushed the virus called sin which infects us all. If we treat the call to repentance lightly, there is a high probability that we will treat the resurrection lightly, too. Lord, preserve us from such sin!

The old Lutheran hymnal from the 1940's has a great prayer summarizing our situation well: "Almighty and most merciful God, our heavenly Father, we, Thine erring children, humbly confess unto Thee that we have justly deserved the chastening which for our sins Thou has sent upon us; but we entreat Thee, of Thy boundless goodness to grant us true repentance, graciously to forgive our sins, to remove from us, or to lighten, our merited punishment, and so to strengthen us by Thy grace that as obedient children we may be subject to Thy will and bear our afflictions in patience; through Jesus Christ, Thy Son, our Lord. Amen." (In Time of Great Sickness)


Good news! Mission Grant #8 for \$30,000 has been fully funded. This grant will be allocated by the South Wisconsin District of LCMS for scholarships to SWD full time church worker students at the seminaries and the Concordia University System. This will help future pastors, teachers, directors of Christian education, deaconesses, and lay ministers as they prepare for their ministries within our Lutheran Church – Missouri Synod. "Jesus said to them 'Go into all the world and preach the good news to all creation.'" Mark 16:15

Mission Grant #9 for our district LWML is **"Alaska Native Discipleship Teen Camp"** for \$16,705. There is a need to help the two teen camps for Alaskan natives by offering scholarships to guide these teenagers and help them to make wise choices as they learn more about Jesus, their Savior. After the first teen camp in 2018, there were 18 teenagers who were baptized. Since that time, the number of teens attending the camp has tripled. For some of these teens, this is the first time that they have learned about Jesus. When this mission grant is funded, LWML-SWD will have reached its goal for the 2018-2020 Biennium. The money that funds all of these mission grants comes from mite donations from the 21 societies of the LWML-SWD. Thank you to all congregation members who have contributed their mites for the spread of the Gospel.

The LWML Zone 3 Rally scheduled for Saturday, April 25, 2020 at Elm Grove Lutheran Church has been cancelled.

Keep the date of Saturday June 20, 2020 open for the LWML-SWD Convention to be held at St. Paul's Lutheran Church in Grafton, WI. Voting for the new Mission Grants for the 2020-2022 Biennium will take place.



Written at the dawn of the Cold War, C.S. Lewis's 1948 book, *On Living in an Atomic Age*, is still relevant. Here's a key excerpt:

"In one way we think a great deal too much of the atomic bomb. 'How are we to live in an atomic age?' I am tempted to reply: 'Why, as you would have lived in the sixteenth century when the plague visited London almost every year, or as you would have lived in a Viking age when raiders from Scandinavia might land and cut your throat any night; or indeed, as you are already living in an age of cancer, an age of syphilis, an age of paralysis, an age of air raids, an age of railway accidents, an age of motor accidents.'

"In other words, do not let us begin by exaggerating the novelty of our situation. Believe me, dear sir or madam, you and all whom you love were already sentenced to death before the atomic bomb was invented: and quite a high percentage of us were going to die in unpleasant ways. We had, indeed, one very great advantage over our ancestors — anesthetics; but we have that still. It is perfectly ridiculous to go about whimpering and drawing long faces because the scientists have added one more chance of painful and premature death to a world which already bristled with such chances and in which death itself was not a chance at all, but a certainty.

"This is the first point to be made: and the first action to be taken is to pull ourselves together. If we are all going to be destroyed by an atomic bomb, let that bomb when it comes find us doing sensible and human things — praying, working, teaching, reading, listening to music, bathing the children, playing tennis, chatting to our friends over a pint and a game of darts — not huddled together like frightened sheep and thinking about bombs. They may break our bodies (a microbe can do that) but they need not dominate our minds."


CONDUCTOR IN TRAINING



May God be with all of you during this time of unrest and uncertainty. The comfort we can all take during this time is that our God is faithful to His people. He promises to be with us and take care of us. We can be sure of this during times such as these.



As you may have heard on the news, Governor Evers has requested that the Health Department close K-12 schools indefinitely. At this point, the faculty and staff are working diligently to provide a digital/blended learning format to assist you through this process. Our goal to continue to reach learning targets as if the students were in the building. That, however, may look different with a digital learning format. The Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction, DPI, has suggested to stress quality of instruction over quantity. It is our goal as educators to utilize Google classrooms to communicate with our students to provide quality assignments in the core content areas: reading, writing, math, science, and social studies. We also feel that physical activity and Social Emotional Learning are critical during this time. Parents should see the assignments and activities reflect that emphasis.

Teachers will be available to answer any questions you may have during normal school hours, 8:05 am - 3:10 pm. Parents should be able to reach them by phone or email. I will be sending an email with a video attached including a devotion and daily announcements every morning.

One of the best pieces of advice that I can give you is to try and keep a normal schedule. I will send out sample schedules of what a typical day might look like for parents at home. Feel free to use them or adjust as necessary. The amount of recommended time for academics in this situation varies by grade level and we will be sensitive to that. Have your children wake up at a consistent time and get themselves ready as if they would for coming to school. Take this time to pray and spend time in devotions together as a family. Play games together, cook together and talk. Find the blessings in this situation. Share pictures with the teachers of the work you are doing at home. We will miss your children and their wonderful smiles.
