From Your Pastor

Christ is risen. He is risen, indeed! Alleluia!

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ, today is the Eve of Ascension. Yes, by the time you read this we will have returned to public worship again! Thanks be to God! Our doors are open for two Divine Services each Sunday starting on May 31, at 8:00 and 10:00 a.m. It just so happens that in the Church's calendar May 31 is also the Feast of Pentecost, the birthday of the Church, so obviously loaded with much symbolism for us this year. Out of the shadows the Church is reemerging. This turning of the corner is a day many of us have longed for.

But before I get to further details, please stay with me and permit me to address a few other, important matters. The last time we were able to gather for Divine Service in groups of more than 10 was March 15, nearly ten weeks ago. During those ten weeks, many of us have continued to gather in small groups of ten or less for short, abbreviated services, keeping the flame of the Church's liturgy burning, while we sang, prayed, and received the Lord's Body and Blood in the Sacrament of the Altar.

As your pastor, I can say without any hyperbole that it's been a really weird experience to do so with only a handful of you saints at a time. Yes, there's been some sense of loneliness as we missed seeing so many familiar faces. But we've also rediscovered the truth that where two or three are gathered in Jesus' name, there He is with us. We always prayed on behalf of those who were unable to be there with us. We've always prayed that God would be merciful and in His perfect timing restore health to the sick, comfort to the dying, and wisdom to the medical world and government leaders as they lead us through this morass.

As a community we've learned new skills in service of the Gospel as we figured out how to record and broadcast services on Youtube. We've come a long way from that first attempt when the camera was directed at the ceiling! Many folks have stepped forward in amazing ways to volunteer, to make themselves available for service in the church and school, and to give generously of their finances in a time of crisis. We have reason also to take our hats off to our school teachers. Our faculty has done great work under the leadership of Principal Corn in learning the needed skills to continue teaching the children committed to our care. During a difficult time, your teachers stepped up to the plate and delivered!

Whether you think that Governor Evers' "safer at home" mandate and WI Secretary Palm's extension was too extreme, not extreme enough, or just right, the fact remains that we have all experienced a form of discipline during the last three months. None of us wanted our lives curtailed in those ways. The author of Hebrews reminds us that no discipline at the time seems pleasant but God

can reap a harvest of righteousness from those who have been trained by it.

This current crisis that is gripping our nation and the world is a season of discipline. God has removed a lot from our lives that gave them definition. Hopefully many of us have discovered silver linings in the cloud of frustrations – new love for our families and the gifts we've enjoyed as a nation, perhaps? The question that remains in my mind, however, is, have we kicked against the discipline of the Lord, wanting our lives back on our terms, or perhaps have we allowed the Lord's discipline to recreate us through repentance and faith more into the image of His Son, Jesus Christ?

In the first video we posted on the EGL Youtube account, I stated my hope that God would be at work in us during this season driving us back to what is most important; that we would emerge on the other side appreciating more deeply the gift of faith in our crucified and risen Lord; the gift of fellowship with other baptized believers around His Word and Sacraments; and the gift of a nation in which we enjoy 1st Amendment rights. Whether my prayer will be answered in the ways I envisioned is yet to be seen. However, God is at work in all things for the benefit of those who love Him. Even in this age of Covid-19, the LORD still cares for us and will not let anything separate His children from Him.

On the facing page you will find a document entitled "A Plan to Resume In-Person Public Worship at Elm Grove Ev. Lutheran Church." This document was put together by the Board of Elders and the Executive Committee. As your elected leadership, they've tried to think through many of the issues involved in such a decision. However, if you think of something that would make you feel safer health-wise in returning to public worship, let us know. We assume there will be adjustments along the way. And there is no judgment on those who, out of an abundance of concern, decide to stay away for a while longer.

While we have all been rightly concerned with this new threat to our world, other big changes to our community have also happened. Several faithful members have reached that significant milestone of work and ministry called retirement! In recent months Mrs. Linda Haut announced her plans to retire effective in July after 33 years of service to the Church (2 years at Christ the Life, 3 years teaching at EGLS, and 28 years as EGL Church Secretary). Mrs. Deb Tesch announced her plans to retire at the end of this academic year with 42 years in the teaching ministry (19 at EGLS). Mrs. Karla Bessert is retiring from 42 years of church and school ministry (28 at EGLS), but is remaining in a contract status with the Church. We also send our thanks and prayers with Principal Heather Corn as she begins her new call as Principal at St. John's Lutheran School in Mayville.

In closing, some of you may not have heard yet that I am staying as your Administrative Pastor. In consultation with the Synod's Office of International Mission [OIM] the decision was made that in these trying times, my place was here at EGL in the parish. I thank you for the many

expressions of support I've received. The feelings of love and appreciation are mutual! We continue to plow together in this acre of God's vineyard known as EGL. However, I also encourage you to join me in praying for the OIM staff and their missionaries. The Rev. Dan McMiller and his team at OIM are doing brilliant work under very difficult circumstances. You can be confident that there are good, even excellent, men and women doing great work serving the Church at large. They deserve our support and our prayers.

A Plan to Resume In-Person Public Worship at Elm Grove Ev. Lutheran Church

- ◆ If you have a compromised immune system, fever or flu-like symptoms, please stay home and worship with us online.
- ◆ Wash your hands for at least 20 seconds. Use hand sanitizer if soap and water are unavailable.
- ◆ Frequently touched surfaces (pew tops, door handles, etc.) will be cleaned and sanitized per CDC recommendations. The elder, chancel assistant and ushers will wipe down the frequently touched surfaces after each service. This is in addition to the regular cleaning being done on a weekly basis by our cleaning team.
- ◆ Worship services will be Sunday mornings at 8:00 a.m. and 10:00 a.m. The 8:00 a.m. service is reserved for individuals 55 and older.
- ◆ Attendance at each service will be limited to 150 including pastors, musicians, elder, chancel assistant, and ushers.
- ◆ An usher should be at each entrance to open the door for attendees. At the West entrance (large parking lot), only the blue doors closest to the elevator will be used to enter the building.
- ◆ Follow the directions of the elder, chancel assistant, ushers and Pastor as you enter church. Procedures may change from week to week.
- ◆ To maintain social distancing in the nave, every other pew will be used. Social distancing of a minimum of 6 feet between people not living in the same household must be followed. Please don't sit in pews marked "closed."
- ◆ The weekly service folder, complete with announcements, will be printed out in its entirety so that the Bibles and hymnals do not need to be used. A small quantity of bibles and hymnals will be available for those who wish to use one.
- ◆ Worshippers should take their copy of the service folder home with them for recycling or paper recycling bins will be at each exit. No worship service folders should be reused.
- ◆ Communion will be offered at all summer services utilizing the continuous, walking distribution format.
 - ◇ The presiding minister will drop the host in the communicant's hand.
 - ◇ The assisting minister or elder will have the individual cups of wine.
 - ◇ A stand with an empty tray will be placed by each front pillar in which the communicants will place the empty individual cup.
- ◆ Appropriate steps are being taken to ensure all communion ware is properly cleaned and sanitized before use.
- ◆ Communion distribution participants will wash their hands with soap and water beforehand. They will also stop and sanitize their hands in front of parishioners at the beginning of the distribution.
- ◆ The collection of offerings will continue to be centralized in the back of the nave.
- ◆ The post-worship social gathering (coffee and snacks) is suspended for the near future.
- ◆ When the service ends, worshippers are encouraged to maintain proper social distancing as they leave the sanctuary.



Unfortunately, the 2020 LWML Convention for June 20, 2020 has been cancelled due to the uncertainty of the restrictions of the Coronavirus. The delegates will be voting for the new 2020-2022

Mission Grants via the US Postal Service. Although the convention will not be held, it is worthwhile to look at the logo, theme, and Bible verse that were planned for this convention. Below, you see the logo for this convention, which has combined the year 2020 with good vision as 20/20. Think about the theme, **"Our Vision in Christ is 20/20."** This is fitting today with all of the changes in our lives, especially with this pandemic. One certainty is that we need Jesus Christ in our lives to guide and lead us in His Way. What is this vision in Christ? The theme Bible verse states it so clearly. "I have been crucified with Christ. It is no longer I who live, but Christ who lives in me. And the life I now live in the flesh I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave Himself for me." Galatians 2:20. Having vision of 20/20 is good. Many of us need glasses to have 20/20 vision. How do we have 20/20 vision in Christ? We need the means of grace that is found in God's Word and the Sacra-

This grant will give scholarships to teens to be able to attend the camp. Since there have been no LWML meetings after March 4, 2020 and since we have not had regular church services in our church, the giving of mites has been limited. If you are able to donate your filled mite boxes, please bring them to the church office or to the church mailbox of Sherri Bond, our LWML treasurer. It is most appreciated.

An interesting note is about an LWMLer, Roberta Hilgen-dorf, who was very active for many years as a music and song leader for our LWML-SWD retreats and conventions. Now as a retired Lutheran teacher, Roberta and her pastor husband are currently serving Sterling Lutheran Church in the Kenai Peninsula of Alaska. Roberta serves as the music and children's ministry director. She wrote the May devotions for *Portals of Prayer*, which I found very interesting and enlightening concerning the Lutheran liturgy. 


