"Empowered by God — Responding by Grace"

November 21 - 22, 2020

" . . . as you excel in everything — in faith, in speech, in knowledge, in all earnestness, and in our love for you — see that you excel in this act of grace also" (2 Cor. 8:7).

We are entering into our annual stewardship emphasis entitled, "Empowered by God — Responding by Grace." During this time, we will consider how God has empowered us and how our response, by grace through faith, can be used by God, especially in the ministry here at Elm Grove Evangelical Lutheran Church.

Just what does it mean to be empowered by God? The Lord Jesus said that His disciples would receive power when the Holy Spirit came upon them (Acts 1:8). That not only happened as He said it would, but we, too, receive God's power by His grace through our faith in Christ as the Holy Spirit takes up residence in us. The words of an anthem by David Clydesdale and Claire Cloninger express this truth clearly: "Empower me! Like a rushing river flowing to the sea, Lord, send Your Holy Spirit flowing now thru me. 'Til I'm living as Your child, victorious and free. Send the power of Your love; empower me!" (Copyright © 1984 John T. Benson Publishing Co./ASCAP. All rights reserved.)

As we experience God's power through faith in Christ, our hearts respond. Our response begins with the realization that God owns everything. As Edwin Frizen stated, " . . . Scripture is full of evidence that all that we have comes from God." God is our Source. God is the Creator and Sustainer of life. God is the Provider of all that we have, whether it be life itself, the air we breathe, water which sustains us, or financial resources through which we obtain the necessities of life. On a daily basis, God demonstrates again and again His abundant power as He "richly provides us with everything to enjoy" (1 Tim. 6:17).

And what should be our response to God's provision for us? According to 2 Corinthians 8:7, we respond by "faith," implicitly trusting God to provide all that we need. We respond by "speech," sharing the good news of the Gospel with others. We respond by "knowledge" through the study of God's Word. We respond in "all earnestness," that is, through a demonstration of the sincerity of our love for the Lord. And we respond by excelling in the grace of giving.

As an example of what it means to give by grace, the Apostle Paul points to the Christians at Macedonia. These were poor people — dirt poor, poor as the proverbial church mice — who were commended by Paul for giving beyond their ability to give. How could they do that? The answer is found in 2 Corinthians 8:5 — " . . . they gave themselves first to the Lord." Giving does not begin with the movement of the hand to the wallet, purse or pocketbook. Giving begins in the heart.

In fact, this principle goes back to God's instruction to Moses in Exodus 25:2, "Speak to the people of Israel, that they take for me a contribution. From every man whose heart moves him you shall receive the contribution for me." This principle is still in operation today. As we give our time, talents and treasure to the Lord, we do so by God's grace because we have already given our hearts to Him.

"Empowered by God — Responding by Grace." That was true of the Macedonian Christians. May it also be true of us here at Elm Grove Evangelical Lutheran Church.

[Christ the King]

Theme: The Glories Yet to Come

– *highlighting the Scriptures for the week* –

The LORD's flock was in disarray. The sheep were scattered, and there was no one to look after them. (Ezekiel) Therefore the LORD Himself promised to shepherd them: none other than David's son – the Lord Jesus – would come and be their shepherd. Though it appears as if His return is delayed, He will surely come. (1 Corinthians) When He comes, the last enemy to be destroyed is death. On the day when Jesus comes, He will separate all who belong to Him by faith and gather them into His eternal Kingdom, but the wicked He will send away to hellfire created for the devil and His angels. (Matthew) So then we live by faith and love; faith in Christ and love for the neighbor. Serving all the least and lowly in His Name, we serve Jesus Christ Himself.

WEEKLY BIBLE READING SCHEDULE

Use the schedule below in your personal devotion. The first three readings are the lessons read today; the last three will be read next Sunday. The Wednesday reading is the psalmody for the week. Each day you may want to pray that psalm or the prayer printed in our service folder today, followed by the suggested reading and your personal requests and thanksgivings to our heavenly Father.

- Wednesday** Psalm 100 Where does the joy of worship come from? What does it mean to be "the sheep of his (the LORD's) pasture?" How does this affect us in tribulation? Why, therefore, are thanksgiving and praise appropriate when in the LORD's presence? What alone lasts forever? What does this mean?
- Thursday** Isaiah 64:1-9 What awesome things had the LORD performed in ancient times? What is it that makes us unclean before the LORD? What does it mean that God is our Father? The potter? What confidence remains forever sure for all believers in Christ? How does this faith help you in specific situations you face this week?
- Friday** 1 Corinthians 1:3-9 For what is the apostle thankful? What spiritual gifts does Christ give His church as they wait for His return? Where does our strength come from? Our endurance? What does this mean?
- Saturday** Mark 13:24-37 Who alone knows the day of Christ's return for judgement? What is the job of his servants? Why is watchfulness required? How is this done? What does this mean in light of false ideas about the end of the world rampant around us today?

CORRECTION: The photo on the front cover of last weekend's service folder was of the Wartburg Castle where Dr Martin Luther stayed in hiding, disguised as Knight George, immediately after the Diet of Worms. The caption under the photo indicated that the castle is in Saxony. Actually it was and is in Thuringia. This part of Thuringia was under the authority of Frederich the Wise, prince of Electoral Saxony, at the time of the Reformation and thus Frederich was able to hide Luther there after his "kidnapping," but the Wartburg technically was not part of Saxony.
