- † Recognizing that a Christian school education requires strong parental support, I agree to volunteer and be involved in school activities as much as possible.
- † In order to help my child grow spiritually, academically, and emotionally I agree to support the efforts of the classroom teacher and staff in achieving this goal.
- † I support and agree with the philosophy and mission of the school as stated in the Parent Handbook. Furthermore, I pledge to adhere to the policies, rules, and regulations as established by the Board of Christian Education.
