From Your Pastor

Most churches in the LCMS use the 3-year lectionary to decide which readings they will use each Sunday; we are currently in year 2 or "series B." It has been interesting preparing for sermons because it was 3 years ago that I started preaching, after passing my first "Homiletics" class at the seminary. When I look back at some of the preparation I did 3 years ago, some of the things that I got out of a passage, it's almost like looking at someone else's notes.


I was certainly at a very different time in my life as I think back to just three years ago. In fact, my life is much different than it was 6 months ago. In the past six months, my daughter was born, I received my call to serve here at Elm Grove, I graduated from the seminary, we moved from St. Louis, my mom sold my childhood home, we bought a house, moved to West Allis, and I started working here at EGL. All those things, along with all of my "firsts" as a pastor which happen each day, have undoubtedly changed me. I see the world differently than I did 6 months ago, and I see the world much differently than I did 3 years ago.

Our experiences shape who we are. They shape our identity, and how we process the world around us. They affect how we interact with Scripture. As I said before, looking back at my notes from three years ago, was like looking at someone else's notes. Scripture was written in

a way which was meant to make you think. It asks big questions and makes big claims. It unapologetically tells a story which challenges you to think differently than you did before.

Psalm 1:1-2 "Blessed is the man who walks not in the counsel of the wicked, nor stands in the way of sinners, nor sits in the seat of scoffers; ²but his delight is in the law of the Lord, and on his law he meditates day and night.


The Psalmist urges us to meditate on God's word day and night, our whole life we are to meditate on God's Word. God's Word is living and active, it is not merely words on a page. God's Word does things, it meets us where we

are and the Holy Spirit works faith in us. As you meditate on God's Word you will find that different things stick out to you, even in stories that you have heard a million times.

As you continue to meditate on God's word throughout your life, you will find that there is a two-way interaction. Your experiences affect

how you interpret scripture, but also Scripture will begin to interpret you, and God's word will begin to shape you. As we grow, as we change, as we move into new periods of our life, God's word will speak differently to us, it will challenge us in different ways. But the message of the Gospel remains the same, that Jesus Christ came to this earth to seek and save the lost, to bring the kingdom of God, and to forgive the sins of all people.

Transom

This window is located above the exit door on the east side of the nave, near the altar. It indicates that our congregation stands solidly upon the Lutheran confessions summed up in the 3 principles: Scripture alone, Grace alone, Faith alone," reproduced here in Latin, which was the formal church language of Luther's day. The "Luther Rose" is centered firmly on the Bible; a further reminder of the Reformation is the rendering of the famous castle at Wittenberg.




Window 1, east side of the nave, next to transom window

Three themes revolve around the birth of Christ — Advent, with the familiar wreath, one pink (joy) and three violet (repentance) candles...the Nativity, with the Chi Rho monogram and Epiphany, joined to the Nativity by the five-pointed star whose rays reach down to three crowns representing the three kings.

The Chi Rho monogram is one of the most ancient of Christian symbols, linking the first two letters of the Savior's name in Greek (Xpistos-Christ) and adding a cross bar to prophesy the coming sacrifice of our Lord.

Singers Bring Harmony to Elm Grove Lutheran

The **Midwest Vocal Express** is an *a cappella* men’s chorus that sings barbershop arrangements and other styles of singing. The chorus (mostly abbreviated as the **MVE**) is in its 32nd year. The chorus sings Spring and Christmas shows and competes with 900 other barbershop choruses worldwide at the Barbershop Harmony Society’s international contests. They will compete in Charlotte, NC in July of 2022 and they will hold a Christmas Concert on December 11, 2021 at Greendale High School in the afternoon.

The MVE Chorus is happy to sing in the EGL cafeteria and occasionally outside in the parking lot. They spent months online during the worst of the COVID pandemic, but they returned to in-person rehearsing for vaccinated members. They still run a simultaneous Zoom session for those who are not vaccinated. While the chorus has had as many as 70 members singing onstage, currently they tend to have about 20 singing with masks at the Elm Grove Lutheran cafeteria from 7-9 p.m. on Monday nights. If you are vaccinated and want to peek into a practice, you are quite welcome. Maybe you want to join singing with them.




LWML is once again making soup jars. This year they have a partner! Cookie jars!!

DID YOU KNOW? FCC to require 10-Digit dialing code for Wisconsin residents beginning Oct. 24th

Beginning October 24, 2021, all customers with the area codes 262, 414, 608, and 920 will need to dial the area code and telephone number in order to connect their local and long-distance calls. This will apply to all calls that are currently dialed with seven digits.

The change comes after the Federal Communications Commissions (FCC) adopted Order FCC 20-100 approving '988' as the three-digit abbreviated dialing code to reach the National Suicide Prevention Lifeline starting July 16, 2022.


Customers will continue to dial 1+ the area code + telephone number for all long-distance calls.


The Lutheran churches and organizations we serve are:


