

SAINT VALENTINE



February 14 marks a commemoration to Saint Valentine. As both a physician and a priest, he ministered to the Christians persecuted in Rome, and died as a martyr, at the command of Emperor Claudius II, in the third century. Commemorations are days set aside in the church year, to remember the saints God has given to His Church, as examples of faithful living (and dying), and as witnesses of God's great mercy to His people. They serve to honor Jesus Christ and His saving work.


Yes, in the calendar of Commemorations in the front of the Lutheran Service Book, our hymnal, St Valentine is listed on February 14. Thus, February 14 is a recognized day in the Church calendar! So, yes, love is a good thing. It's a gift from God, to be enjoyed and celebrated within the parameters that God has set up for our benefit. Of course, as one of the things God created, He gets to establish how it should be experienced. Because Christians sometimes get the reputation of being stoic, unromantic, or even prudish, I find it a little ironic that this day of celebrating love is named after a faithful Christian man! But to fully appreciate St Valentine's Day and celebrate it appropriately, it's important to know the 'rest of the story,' as Paul Harvey used to say.

Valentine was a martyr; that means he was a Christian who died because of his witness for Jesus Christ. In fact, the word "martyr" comes from the Greek language, meaning to bear witness. Martyrs, thus, are Christians who continue to bear witness right up until the point of death. Valentine refused to renounce his faith in our Lord and thus was executed. That's how far Valentine's love for his Lord took him. He counted his present sufferings not worth comparing with the love that God had for him.

Tradition has it that he was initially a physician and pastor living in Rome during the reign of Roman Emperor Claudius. During an age when many Christians were being martyred, Valentine became one of the noted martyrs of the third century. The commemoration of his death, which occurred in AD270, became a part of the calendar of remembrance in the Early Church of the West. Tradition suggests that on the day of his execution for his Christian faith, Valentine left a note of encouragement for a child of his jailer written on an irregularly shaped piece of paper. This greeting became a pattern for millions of written expressions of love and caring that now are the highlight of Valentine's Day in many nations.

Valentine refused to renounce his faith in our Lord and thus was executed. That's how far Valentine's love for his Lord took him. He counted his present sufferings not worth comparing with the love that God had for him.

On the Commemorations page of LSB you will find this quote from the Augsburg Confession Article 21: "Our churches teach that the remembrance of the saints is to be commended in order that we may imitate their faith and good works according to our calling." If we are a physician or other medical person, we can look to Valentine or Luke for encouragement. If we are a government official, we can look to King David or Daniel as a government adviser.

That same page goes on to explain that there is "great benefit in remembering the saints whom God has given to His Church. The Apology of the Augsburg Confession (Article 21) gives three reasons for such honor. First, we thank God for giving faithful servants to His Church. [Such faithful servants as instruments of God preserve the Church from generation to generation.] Second, through such remembrance our faith is strengthened as we see the mercy that God extended to His saints of old. [If God had mercy on them, He can and has promised to have mercy on us, too.] Third, these saints are examples by which we may imitate both their faith and their holy living according to our calling in life."

God has called His faithful from many different walks of life; we are not the first generation of Christians. Thus, we should look to the past as we follow Christ in our day and age.

"Their [those faithful who have gone before us] defense of the fundamental beliefs of the Christian faith and/or their virtuous living have caused these individuals to stand out over time as persons worthy of recognition. In every case, the purpose of our remembrance is NOT that we honor these saints for their own sake, but as examples of those in whom the saving work of Jesus Christ has been made manifest to the glory of His holy name and to the praise of His grace and mercy."




The Stained Glass Art

Death with Dignity: another view

To the Editor:

My heart bled as I read John Torinus' piece on his brother and sister-in-law's decision to end their lives together in order to stop their common suffering (FREEMAN, January 12). Who could not be moved by their gripping story? Tom's long battle with rheumatoid arthritis, his vitality sapped by pain and increasing reliance on opioids. Mary's incurable deep dementia and all that meant for a bleak future.

I have no quarrel with Mr. Torinus' compassionate understanding and his love for his brother. God bless him for it.

However, I want to offer the citizens of our fine community, still reeling from the senseless violence of last November's Christmas parade, another perspective on the end of life.

You see, I recently buried my bride of over 50 years, Jane Nessel Senkbeil, who endured more than 25 years of constant pain and increasing disability and then finished her life completely bedbound for more than 14 months, utterly dependent on me and our wonderful hospice team for most of her bodily functions. She too took opioids to relieve her pain, though they really didn't do the job: there was never a day when she wasn't in significant pain. I wouldn't wish that condition on my worst enemy. To watch my wife suffering such long decline and final indignation, I assure you, was excruciatingly difficult for all who loved her – especially me, our adult children, and our children's children .

Yet there wasn't a caregiver who entered our home during her final year of life who wasn't moved by her zest for life, her quiet but unflinching faith in God, her gentle but feisty wit, and her genuine interest in them and their families. Frankly, her patience put me to shame. It was an honor to devote my every waking moment to her care.


I'm not bragging about my wife nor my performance as a caregiver. I simply want to stress that ending life prematurely is not the only way to address intense suffering. With the love and support of many people around you, you can not only survive, but thrive under extraordinarily difficult conditions.

Finally, if you happen to be a Christian, you will discover the joy hidden in suffering: when we know Christ and the power of his resurrection, we frequently also share in the fellowship of his sufferings. (Philippians 3:10)

- anyone that is out-going, energetic, loud, and loves EGL basketball that has an interest in announcing during the tournament!




