In this 1789 painting by the French artist, Charles Thevenin, titled “*Joseph is Recognized by his Brothers,*” Joseph’s brothers show remorse for having sold him into slavery, and feared his revenge. Joseph had been brought to Egypt 20 years earlier, where he eventually fell into Pharaoh’s favor after interpreting his dreams. As a result, he became a high-ranking person among the Egyptians. When drought fell upon their homeland, his brothers sought aid and refuge in Egypt. There, they received assistance from Joseph.

The verse illustrates how bad things in life can result in unexpected, good outcomes. Joseph pardoned his brothers’ trespasses, and demonstrated the power of the forgiveness of sins. The bad things in life have in them the seed of value. The key is how we handle life’s experiences, and the choices we make to influence outcomes.

From Your Pastor

Lenten Journey 2022

Under the theme of "You meant it for evil, but God meant it for good," EGL will embark on our Lenten journey this year by looking at how God turns our sinful hearts and desires into something good. As the author of life, and the One who controls the entire universe, God works all things together for good for those who love Him (ala Romans 8). We will read systematically through Luke 22 and 23, ending with the resurrection in chapter 24. From the way Judas betrays Jesus to the way the scribes and pharisees plan for Christ's crucifixion, evil intentions are at work among all the players, except Jesus, but all of these machinations are anticipated and woven into the tapestry of work Christ does for our salvation.

With the exception of Ash Wednesday and Holy Week, our midweek services will make use of the Order of Compline at 6:30 p.m., a Prayer Office we have not used recently but is well suited for an end-of-the-day time of devotion. Please note that there is only the one evening service each Wednesday; there is no 4:00 p.m. service. For years we held a 4:00 service also in order to appeal to school families, seeing as school was dismissed at 3:30. With the change of dismissal time to 3:00 in recent years, it was not realistic to expect families to hang around for that hour. This change also brings our Advent and Lent midweek service times into alignment.

The Imposition of Ashes on Ash Wednesday will be

offered at 7:30 a.m. in the nave, but also again at 6:00 p.m., up until 6:15, at which time we will prepare for the service. There will be a short, printed-out rite for the congregation to follow before the imposition.


Thankfully many hands make the work easier. Because a number of groups have volunteered to prepare meals, you can count on a delicious

meal each Wednesday, beginning already March 2, from 5:30-6:15.

The Sundays during these weeks leading up to Easter are always referred to as Sundays IN Lent, because even during this penitential season there is a little, even if subdued, remembrance of the resurrection.

Liturgically, every Sunday is a little Easter. Although we will continue to pray through Divine Service Setting 3 on Sundays, you will note a couple of differences, most notably the Hymn of Praise goes away for the season. We won't sing "Alleluia" either before the Gospel reading. However, we will sing the Introit and then the Gloria Patri. At the end of the service we will again hear the three-fold "Amen," which for our older folks will harken back to the old TLH [The Lutheran Hymnal] days. Also, you will find printed out in the service folder unique verses for each week sung before the Gospel reading, but without the "Alleluia" bookends. This may sound strange or incomplete, but that's part of the subdued Lenten experience. We are "fasting" from praise as we walk the road our Lord took to the cross and empty tomb.

May our gracious God richly bless your Lenten journey!

The Stained Glass Art at our Church Depicts the Life of Christ




The miracle of the loaves and fishes is represented in the lower window, showing that the two fish and five loaves not only fed the multitude, but left baskets of fragments greater than the original.


Congratulations to one of our teachers, Pam Ganswindt!
