

From Your Pastor

What is proper attire for worship? Of course, the best thing to wear is the robe of Christ's righteousness! In fact, without that, you cannot offer an acceptable sacrifice of thanksgiving nor receive His gift of forgiveness. If you want to worship the true God at all, you must have faith in His Son, Jesus Christ. This is how the Lutheran Confessions describe it: "Faith is that worship which receives the benefits that God offers; the righteousness of the law is that worship which offers God our own merits. God wants to be honored by faith so that we receive from him those things that he promises and offers" (Apology, Article IV, p. 128 Kolb/Wengert).

Having said that, when we ask the question, what should we wear to church, most people think in terms of clothes. And that's what I want to address today. What is proper attire for worship?

It was not that long ago when people thought in terms of "Sunday best" clothes, meaning that we got dressed up for worship. The intention was not to impress (or scandalize!) the other members at church but to recognize that worship was holy ground. When we get cleaned up and wear our Sunday best, we are communicating something about our attitudes. We are "confessing," you might say, that gathering together as the Body of Christ to receive His Word and Sacraments is different from the rest of the week. What we do here – to receive God's gifts by faith and to return our thanks and praise for all of His unmerited grace to us – is different from our daily work and study. The hours we spend at church are an offering to the Lord, and we know that the Lord deserves the first fruits of our time, talent, and treasure.

Generally speaking, then, what does that look like clothes


-wise? Consider what you would wear to an interview for your dream job, or if you had an opportunity to meet a well-known person whom you really admired. You wouldn't wear a tuxedo or a prom dress. You probably wouldn't wear shorts or leggings either. You wouldn't aim to make a statement or draw attention. You would aim for clean, sharp, respectful.

Now, I will be first in line to say that I would rather have you in worship, dressed in your athletic or gardening clothes, than not in worship at all. How you are dressed ought not keep you from the House of the Lord. However, what happens by accident ought not become the rule. This gets back to our attitude and before whom we think we are gathering.

The author of Hebrews writes it clearly when addressing the topic of worship: "Therefore let us be grateful for receiving a kingdom that cannot be shaken, and thus let us offer to God acceptable worship, with reverence and awe, for our God is a consuming fire" (12:28-29). I suspect if we remembered more often that God is a consuming fire, we might think differently about how we approach Him, including what we wear.

The story is told about what happened the first time Martin Luther celebrated the Lord's Supper as a priest. Many people had come to witness this significant event, only to see Luther go quiet and then eventually stumble over the words and rush through the rest of the service. Asked later if he had forgotten the words, he said no. Instead he was overcome with dread at the thought that in his sinful hands, he was holding the Body and Blood of God. He took the words of Jesus at face value and reacted with "reverence and awe."

On Sunday, March 6, at about 1:30 a.m., Elm Grove Police, Fire and Emergency Medical Services responded to an "active structure fire" at our property that had served as a childcare facility. The building was not currently in use. High winds caused a tree limb to fall on power lines that created sparks on the roof, resulting in the fire.

The home was built by the congregation in 1957 for EGL's first principal, Robert Nieting, and his family. Carmen and Bob Nieting raised their family in the home.



Happy 100th Birthday to Carmen Nieting!

The day of Carmen’s birth, April 9, 1922, was Palm Sunday. She entered life that day, in the Lutheran parsonage of St John’s LCMS in Culbertson, Nebraska. Her father, Pastor Arthur Wegener, was next door leading worship, while his wife, Magdalene, was home giving birth. That parsonage is still used, 100 years later, for the pastor and his family.

Carmen had two siblings. Older brother Ralph became an LCMS pastor, and younger sister, Iris, was a nurse.

After two years of local high school, Carmen enrolled in Concordia Seward to finish high school and begin college for teacher education. There she met Robert Nieting, and soon began teaching in Charter Oak, Iowa, the town next to Ute, where Bob’s father was the pastor. During WW2, both she and Bob, who also studied education, were placed in different schools in New York. They got married over Christmas vacation, on December 27, 1942.



After the war, Bob received a Call to Marengo, Illinois, as a principal, and teacher. Son Mark was born in 1948, and daughter Lesley, in 1951. In 1955, our church extended a call to Bob to become principal. The third of the Nieting’s children, Alicia, joined the family in 1963.

Carmen and Bob traveled extensively, visiting all 47 lower states plus much of Europe. After Bob’s sight was diminished, Carmen did all the driving, even on vacations! Bob died in 2014.

Many of her interests included playing tennis, and the violin, as well as singing in the choir. Music has been a passion - she has taught literally hundreds of children to play the piano, and only recently has arthritis limited her own ability to play.

Carmen served on the LWML for years, as the copy editor for the national newsletter.

She is a daunting Scrabble opponent, and enjoys solving word puzzles.

Carmen daily thanks God for all His blessings and mercy, love and protection, that has enabled her to celebrate the marvel of living for a century! To Him be the glory.




The top photo shows the Exultate Ringers at their weekly practice. The Intrada Ringers, in the second photo above, are the introductory-level group of handbell ringers.

Musical Groups Practice for Lenten and Easter Services


The gift of music at our church enriches our worship services immensely, especially at this time of the church year.
