

# From Your Pastor

When you think about the Reformation the first hymn that comes to your mind is more than likely the classic, A Mighty Fortress is Our God. The hymn was of course written by Martin Luther and certainly encapsulates his theology and therefore the theology of the Reformation. However, there is another hymn which is commonly sung on Reformation Sunday and certainly

deserves consideration for the title of "Hymn of the Reformation." That hvmn is the classic Salvation Unto Us Has Come, written by Paul Speratus in 1523, only six years after the posting of the 95 Thesis.

Speratus was a learned and ordained preacher who served a few locations around Germany. As a married man, he quickly became a pariah in the catholic church, not because he was

married, but instead because he chose to openly criticize the ban on priest marriage. There were, of course, many priests who were married, but the far greater crime was to criticize church dogma. Eventually, after much persecution and even imprisonment, Speratus would make his way to Wittenberg and be of great service in translating some of Luther's books into different languages. A difficult task, which continues to this day due to the large amount that Luther wrote.

The Hymn's deep and rich theology is spelled out clearly

and much could be written about each verse. There are ten verses to this hymn and each one is richer than the previous but it is certainly worth being sung. Perhaps it's most suitable place in the Divine Service is to be sung as the office hymn. As a preacher, I have found that the richer the theology of the Office, or Sermon, Hymn, the less pressure is on me.

With such an excellent hymn that balances Law and Gospel so well, the pressure on the preacher is almost gone because his audience has already heard and read an

> excellent sermon. However, of course, the flipside is correct as well, it is certainly a tough act to follow.

Either way, Salvation unto Us Has Come, is an excellent addition to the Divine Service because it so clearly expresses to us the total state of our depravity, and also the faith which has been given to us as gift, so that we might receive the promises of the

We will likely sing A Mighty Fortress is Our God this coming reformation Sunday, however, perhaps in your own devotions you may decide to read Speratus' hymn as a prayer, and reflect on the amazing gift of Salvation which has come to us through the death and the resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ. Even better, as you sit around the table that evening, alone or with your family, sing it! As St. Augustine probably said, "The one who sings, prays twice."

## **Stewardship Message**

"Working Together — Celebrating God's Good Gifts" is the theme of this year's annual stewardship emphasis. This is based on 1 Corinthians 3:9 which reads "For we are God's fellow workers".

It takes many hands — working together — to accomplish all that takes place in a church like Elm Grove Evangelical Lutheran Church. Some of those "hands" are highly visible as they lead worship services, usher, teach Sunday school classes, or participate in musical presentations. Others are not seen as much as they labor behind the scenes in the office, cleaning the building, serving on committees, or in many other ways.

That is true of all types of organizations, but what sets the church apart — especially a church like Elm Grove Evangelical Lutheran Church — is that we are not just Think about it: Every good gift is from God. All He reworking by ourselves and for ourselves. We are working together hand in hand with Almighty God. As Annie Johnson Flint wrote, "Christ has no hands but our hands to do His work today."

What we are doing, whether it is one of the highly visible functions or one of the behind-the-scenes tasks, we are doing for God's glory. We are "God's fellow workers." We are truly working together with God! And as we do so, we have the opportunity to celebrate God's good gifts to us.

As God's children, sometimes our emphasis is on things like food, clothing, shelter, crops, and a land which brings forth His bounty in abundance. As we benefit from God's good gifts like these and many others, our response should be one of thanksgiving and gratitude to Him.

But God's good gifts are also spiritual in nature. For example, God gave the gift of His Son, the Lord Jesus

Christ, to be our Savior. Without doubt, this is the greatest gift of all! God gives the gift of faith so that people can trust Christ for salvation. God gives the gift of grace, which is an expression of His unconditional love towards us. God gives the gift of wisdom to those who ask Him. God gives the Holy Spirit to us to help us in our Christian lives and in our praying. God gives spiritual gifts which enable us to serve Him and to minister to others. He even provides as special gifts the people who work in His kingdom as pastors, teachers, and missionaries.

Perhaps the gifts of God are best summarized in James 1:17.

> Every good gift and every perfect gift is from above, coming down from the Father of lights, with whom there is no variation or shadow due to change.

Obedience has been defined as doing what God says, when God says, with the right heart attitude. LWML Sunday will be celebrated at our church on Sunday, October 8. Visit our LWML display in the back of church. You can pick up new mite boxes, brochures, previous issues of the quarterlies, various items of interest about missions, and view the Mission Grant Chart of our South Wisconsin District. During our worship service we will have the opportunity to sing the LWML Song, pray for the LWML and its ministry, and hear about the LWML in the sermon.

I would like to share with you a brief history of how and where the LWML grew from small beginnings to the large organization it is now. In the 1941 Convention of the LCMS, approval was given for the creation of a national women's organization. On July 7-8, 1942 the LWML was founded at St. Stephen Lutheran Church in Chicago, IL with over 100 women in attendance and 28 voting delegates from 15 districts of the LCMS. This was the small beginning of LWML. With our country at war, rationing of various goods and food was part of the sacrifices that citizens of our country faced. But, the result of the voting for the one and only mission project of the 1943-1945

biennium was set at \$15,000 for Christ Church for the Deaf in Cleveland, Ohio. The women donated pennies, nickels, dimes, and guarters in mite boxes. That was a lot of money back then, but they met their goal. Another interesting fact is that on July 24, 1951, the LWML selected purple and gold as its official colors. Purple because it symbolizes royalty, and gold because it symbolizes value and integrity. At the present time, LWML is represented by all 35 districts of the LCMS. At its LWML National Convention in Milwaukee the goal for Mission Grants was set at \$2,350,000 for the 2023-2025 biennium. This will fund missions in the United States of America and foreign missions. The Lord has truly blessed us abundantly. I might add that LWML stands for **L**utheran **W**omen's Missionary League.

happy, something happens to snatch that happiness away from you. But joy is an entirely different matter. Jesus told his disciples that although happiness is fleeting, joy is eternal: "So also you have sorrow now, but I will see you again, and your hearts will rejoice, and no one will take your joy from you" (John 16:22).

You and I both know faithful ministry isn't always fun, especially these days. Those who live according to the precepts of God's word rather than the trends of the day face increasing opposition and persecutions, both subtle and

Take your delight in being the Savior's untiring sheepdog, knowing that when the chief Shepherd appears you will hear with your own ears: "Well done, good and faithful servant. You have been faithful over a little; I will set you over much. Enter into the joy of your master" (Matt 25:23)."

Pastors, directors of Christian Education (DCE), deaconesses, music directors, administrative and maintenance staff, and teachers - every church worker vocation helps proclaim the Good News!
