

From Your Pastor

Dear fellow redeemed in the blood of Christ,

Permit me to address several things of interest to us in our life together as the body of Christ.

On Saturday evening, Oct 21, EGL enjoyed a Luther movie screening. I likened this gathering to a family reunion, where all the different branches of the family got a chance to remember and retell the stories that shape the family. In this case, we heard the stories again of Luther's life and work. He was a man who walked through life with mud on his boots, but he was also a man greatly used by the Holy Spirit in the reforming of the Church. (And if the Church planted in Corinth by the great apostle St Paul was in need of reforming just 30 years after its start, we can assume that the Church in Germany at 1,000 years after its planting would also need reforming!) So, we came together that night to eat and drink together, and to remember the stories of our common great-grandpa Martin Luther. Warts and all, we are part of the same family.

Some of you have mentioned to me that it seems like the Lord has thrown us several curves balls lately. We've lost a couple of faithful workers to our ministry team with Pr Reseburg and Deaconess Ewert taking new calls. It's easy in such situations to wonder, what are we doing wrong, even though both have publicly expressed their appreciation to EGL for the time spent here?

Of course, reassessing who we are and where we want to be are always good questions. As is the desire to continually do better the work God has given us. In any call situation, both workers and congregations get the opportunity to reevaluate who they are and what God wants them to be doing. You've heard me say before that it is comforting to know that those we love are still working in the same vineyard; they've simply moved to a different acre in that vineyard. Deaconess Christiana and Pr Reseburg have been loved and appreciated here at EGL, and we can be thankful that they are not running from us but rather

feeling drawn to new areas of service.

It is important for you as members of EGL to know as we go forward that the Lord's love for you has not changed one iota. As the bride of Christ, you are still the apple of His eye, His pearl of great price that He was willing to sell all He had (the life of His only begotten Son!) Your identity is still secure, even as we have an opportuni-

ty to rediscover the work and ministry opportunities He has given to us right here in Elm Grove. You are baptized Christians who have been washed in the blood of the Lamb. You belong to Him.

But He does have work for us to do, work that He prepared in advance for us to do, ala Ephesians 2. In God's perfect timing we will be strengthened in that identity and rediscover our congregational goals. This month on Nov 11 EGL will host its first WHY Discovery event, in which we share the stories that have shaped our identities here and given us so much joy. We will see how God has shaped us as His people through Word and Sacrament over the decades and how He has worked through us in many and various ways to impact the world around us. Your participation will be a great encouragement to others, as we share the family stories.

That shared identity and common work is also the focus of this year's Stewardship Drive in the month of November, as we focus on "Working Together and Celebrating God's Good Gifts." In Luther's explanation to the first three petitions of the Lord's Prayer, we see a repeated refrain - that God's name is holy all by itself, and that God's kingdom and His will are going to happen even without our prayer – but we pray earnestly that His name would be kept holy among us and that His kingdom and will would happen among us also. By faith we earnestly desire to work together with one another in harmony and with God, always rejoicing in our baptismal identity and the great privilege God bestows on us to be called children of God. And all of this for the purpose of glorifying God and participating with Him in the expansion of His kingdom of grace!

The Stewardship committee is eager to share this second letter expressing our annual campaign.

"Working Together — Celebrating God's Good Gifts"

Stewardship has been compared to a three-legged stool consisting of the "three Ts" — **time, talents and treasure**. Removing any one of these three from our stewardship emphasis will cause severe weakness and damage to our church.

Repeatedly, the Bible emphasizes God's ownership of everything and our role as managers and stewards of what God has entrusted to us. Our use of time, talents and treasure is the clear teaching of Scripture: God owns it all!

"Time" is an important subject to God. There are over 230 references to "time" in the Bible. Those who walk in a wise manner are described in one translation as people who are "redeeming the time" (Eph. 5:16).

"Redeeming the time" means that we are to make the most of every opportunity to invest our time and our talents in things that really count. This is mainly in the lives of people and in service to Christ. We can take to heart what Christ said and seek first His kingdom and His righteousness by putting "first things first" in the use of our time and talents here at EGL.

When it comes to our finances, we have choices. We can

spend them on things that do not matter in "the long run," things that do not count for eternity. Save them for that "rainy day", that is yet to come. Fail to share with others who are in need and limit ourselves when it comes to giving back to the Lord.

When we take any of these approaches, we act as though the money is really ours. We fail to recognize the truth of Deuteronomy 8:18: "You shall remember the Lord your God, for it is he who gives you power to get wealth." When we act as though the money is ours, we fail to glorify God in its use and fail to "seek first the kingdom of God" in our giving and in our living.

As you consider the time, talents and treasure God has given to you may want to pray this prayer: "Lord, as you provide, by faith, this is how I intend to give." Remember that we are "Working Together — Celebrating God's Good Gifts."

As we step out by faith, working together and trusting God to provide, it will be amazing to watch God bless our efforts more than we might ask or even think (Ephesians 3:20).

Thank you for your faithfulness to the Lord and to the ministry of EGL. Thank you for your consistency in giving of your time, talents, and treasure to the work of the Lord here. And thank you for what you are going to do in the future in celebration of God's good gifts!



"To _____, so that _____"
(with "to ____" as the contribution and "so that ____" as the impact).

There was a true readiness to contribute to the discussion and be an active part in the process. The Evening Group of EGL LWML will also meet in the **Fellowship Hall** on Monday, November 13 at 6:30 p.m. and will put dry cookie ingredients into jars for our fund raiser. As in all our meetings, we will have a short devotion.

The proceeds of this fund raiser will be used to send two Voting Delegates and two Young Women Representatives to the LWML-SWD Convention in June to be held at Bethlehem Lutheran Church in Sun Prairie, WI. You may purchase soup and/or cookie jars in the lower entry of the church on Sunday, November 26. The price is \$7.00 each or 3 for \$20.00.

Soon to be fully funded is LWML-SWD Mission Grant #10 "DOXOLOGY Care for Clergy Wives." The purpose of DOXOLOGY is to gather clergy together to receive mentoring from professionals that they may return to their flocks refreshed, encouraged, and spiritually renewed. This \$8,000 mission grant will enable 50 clergy wives from the South Wisconsin District to attend the first pilot program for clergy wives to participate in DOXOLOGY. This will be a 2 day/one night event. The

clergy wives will be given tools to understand compassion fatigue for their husbands and their families and how to establish healthy boundaries. And, they will be given tools to grow spiritually and mentally. To God be the glory!



The objective of the Elm Grove Lutheran Foundation is to provide resources to enhance, support and encourage the work of God's church here on earth. There are three types of funds: Living Endowment Funds, Capital Funds, and Specified Funds. Donations are always welcome. The Foundation Board is made up of 8 elected members, the pastor (s), principal, and the President of the Congregation.

One of the main focuses of the Foundation is Lutheran education. We support the education of those studying to be Lutheran teachers, deaconesses, and pastors. In addition, we also are able to support a variety of mission projects both in our congregation and throughout the world.

In 2022, the Foundation supported a number of different projects and dispersed \$43,978.05.

The Foundation supported a number of scholarships for students in Christian education, pre-seminary, and seminary. We also supported mission work in South Africa. One of the largest programs we supported was covering the cost of the Ambassador of Reconciliation program. Donations were also made to the following organizations; Lutheran Digest, Concordia Historical Institute, Lutheran Bible Translators, and LCMS Motor Cycles for Evangelism.


ARTICLE XIX. ELM GROVE EVANGELICAL LUTHERAN CHURCH FOUNDATION

The Elm Grove Evangelical Lutheran Church Foundation shall be maintained and controlled by the Voters' Assembly of Elm Grove Evangelical Lutheran Church as a corporate entity organized under the laws of the State of Wisconsin and shall be operated by a board of directors, responsible to the members of the Foundation, in accordance with the provisions of its articles of incorporation and corporate bylaws. Any amendments to the articles of incorporation shall be subject to approval by the members of the Foundation.

The purpose of the Foundation shall be to:

- A. Invest and reinvest, manage and control all monies and properties, real and personal, the principal and increase thereof which may be received by the Foundation.
- B. Use said monies and properties for the benefit of Elm Grove Evangelical Lutheran Church of Elm Grove Wisconsin, or for other purposes deemed by its Board of Directors, as defined in its bylaws, to be consistent with the philosophy, purposes, and policies of the Congregation.
- C. Comply, insofar as possible, with the wishes and directions of donor or donors of said monies or properties as declared in the deed or instrument of gift, if any, and
- D. Do all acts and things which will be necessary and/or convenient in the operation of the Foundation, including buying, selling, leasing, exchanging, and dealing in any and all kinds of property, real or personal.

The membership of the Foundation shall consist of all communicant members of the Congregation who have reached the legal voting age of the State of Wisconsin.




