Acts of the Spirit on Our 2023 Trip to China

Between September and November, my wife and I took a seven-week long trip to visit our loved ones in China. It has been about four years since we visited China last time before the COVID-19. We had many familial things planned for our trip, including celebrating (actually, one year in advance for men according to Chinese custom) the 90th birthday of my father-in-law who's probably suffering Alzheimers, persuading my struggling 88 year old motherin-law to commit her husband into a nursing home instead of taking care of him by herself (in addition, she was taking care of her only remaining son who suffered a stroke two years ago), and lastly, handling my father's inheritance with my two sisters since he passed away in the beginning of last year while China was still in lock-down.

More importantly to us, and interesting to you, my fellow EGLers, is that, besides visiting loved ones in China, the Holy Spirit had prompted us to take advantage of this trip for His mission and ministry, such as visiting our fellow missionaries in Taiwan and visiting folks we knew who might be open to hear the Gospel or need strengthening of their faith. How glad we were as we followed the Holy Spirit's lead! Not only have we had a wonderful family visit, but also witnessed the acts of the Spirit on our trip. Thank you for your prayers, we safely returned home without any glitches about two months ago. As many of you asked about our trip, you might be interested and encouraged in receiving a brief trip report highlighting some acts of the Spirit on our trip.

The first highlight is at the first stop, Taiwan. This is our very first visit to Taiwan and we've found that Taiwan is clean and convenient, and Taiwaneses are very kind and helpful to tourists. Besides sightseeing, the beautiful island and tasting their delicious foods, we took a bullet train to Chiayi, where we visited The Saving Grace Church of our Partner Synod in Taiwan and attended their divine service with them (about 30 of them, half LCMS missionaries and their family members). They warmly welcomed us, and notably we were glad to meet Pr. and Mrs. Wu, our long-time missionary Rev. Michael Paul and his wife Irene, our LCMS Asia Regional Director Rev. Charles Ferry, etc. Do you know that LCMS began to send missionaries to Taiwan about the time EGL was founded (in the 1950s)? Do you know they have a seminary in Chiayi?

The second highlight is at the second stop, Guangdong, where we visited our friend X and his wife Y, and their handsome son, Jimmy. Because X eagerly searched for comfort, hope and meaning of life after the passing of both his parents during the COVID-19, we were led by the Spirit and so planned to bring the Gospel to him during our visit. How surprised we were that no sooner had they helped us to set up our smartphones for calls as well as g-mails in China, both X and his son Jimmy began to ask us lots of questions about the Bible and the Gospel! Except for some sightseeing in the glittering and raucous metro-

politan Guangzhou, we spent most of our three-day visit sharing our faith in Jesus Christ with them in their quiet home. Since X showed tremendous interest in Christian faith, we invited him to join our weekly Friday night (Saturday morning in China) online Bible study while his son Jimmy joined my newly created Wednesday morning (Wednesday evening in China) online ESL class together with two other young men. Isn't this encouraging? Jesus Christ sent us out on His great mission (Matt 28:19-20), and we got to watch the Holy Spirit drawing all people to Him (John 12:32)!

The third highlight is at a stop on our returning trip, Jiangxi, where we visited our classmate H and his wife L. Here I'd like to point out the miraculous work of the Holy Spirit (John 3:8) that not long after we visited them about seven years ago, L became a Christian. Since then, God has led us to revisit them every time we visited China in order to strengthen L's faith in Jesus Christ. Indeed God had purposefully sent us to them this time, for as soon as we sat down at their dining table, L asked me, "Sam, I used to be enthusiastic in reading the Bible and going to Bible study. How come I'm no longer so passionate?" Wow, what a leading of the Holy Spirit. Seizing the opportunity, I began to share with her John 15 that Jesus is the true vine and our Father is the vinedresser. I encouraged her to live in the Word, grow in serving and suffering, and trusting God's promise instead of feelings. Meanwhile we also invited L to join our Friday night online Bible study, which she gladly accepted and joined. Moreover, that night after I got up for the bathroom at 2 am and went back to bed, I couldn't sleep but kept thinking about L's question. Suddenly, I realized that she's not alone to have such a lapse in her faith journey and the Holy Spirit urged me to write up how Christians live and grow as the topic for one of the two presentations I later gave to my online Bible study group in Beijing. So I got up and spent the next two hours outlining the presentation and finding the pertinent Bible verses. Only then could I go back and have a sound sleep.

The fourth highlight is at our last stop of our trip, Beijing (or Peking as Western pronunciation), where we visited the members of our Friday night online Bible study group. Before the trip, they made a point to invite us to visit them. Indeed, the joy was overwhelming when we met in person. They commented, "Now we know you are real!". Moreover, they asked me to give them two presentations to address their concerns. You have already read in my last highlight I got the idea for one of my presentations. Yet, it was not until we arrived in Beijing, the last stop on our trip, that I got the idea for the other presentation. Although I knew that China is a work-righteous culture, it was the experience from this trip that helped me gain insight why it's often a huge obstacle for Chinese to understand and appreciate Lutheran's central doctrine i.e., sola fide, even after we had talked about the relationship between Christian Faith and Good Works several times before. This trip gave me fresh ideas and a new approach on how to explain it to them thoroughly. They appreciated both of my presentations with very positive feedback. BTW: Since we started this Friday night online Bible study more than two years ago, they've been so enthusiastic in

studying the Bible. Our Bible study generally lasts about died for our neighbors too. 


