VICAR LEE ORDINATION: It doesn't happen every day that a congregation gets to see a man from within her own ranks go off to seminary and then get ordained. As you all know Dr Samuel Lee has completed his Specific Ministry Pastor program studies through Concordia Theological Seminary in Fort Wayne, Indiana. We have the joy of seeing him ordained here at EGL on Pentecost Day, May 19, at the regular 9:00 a.m. service. What an opportunity for EGL to see this process brought to completion on Pentecost! Thanks are due to you, the congregation, for your support over the last 4+ years! Please set aside that day on your calendars.

WHY DISCOVERY: Last November EGL began the WHY DISCOVERY process with South Wisconsin District Mission Executive Dr Nathan Meador as our facilitator. This process seeks to help congregations re-appreciate who they are in Christ and the work that God has prepared for them to do in their specific acres of God's vineyard, ala Ephesians 2:10. The WHY statement we've developed in collaboration with Meador is: "God has established EGL to proclaim Christ, receiving and sharing His gifts in Word and Sacrament." Broad in scope, this statement is meant

to give purpose and anchor all the activities we do in receiving and sharing the gifts of God. Very soon you will see (likely on the wall in the overflow room) space for adding sticky notes under 5 different subcategories all the events and activities EGL engages in. You are invited to participate and help identify all the things we do, under the applicable subcategory. Those five areas are: education, fellowship, Divine Service and pastoral care, reconciliation, and outreach. Once we see them all on display, we can ask ourselves, how does each activity support that goal of receiving God's gifts and sharing them with others?

DID YOU KNOW? For the groups that often meet in the Bartelt Center, here's some useful information. There is now full internet access there. Maintenance man Paul Pfaff recently extended the work begun a couple of years ago from the Fellowship Hall to the living room of the old parsonage by running the necessary wiring and adding a WiFi extender/booster. Use the same network and password you'd use anywhere else in the Church.

MINISTRY AMONG NATIVE AMERICANS: Two streams of generosity came together during Lent. As you know, the free-will offerings associated with the midweek Lenten meals were earmarked for Lutheran Indian Ministries [LIM]. Then, unexpectedly, the Board of Evangelism designated the Maundy Thursday and Good Friday offerings for LIM also. As a result a check for \$3,768 was hand delivered to the LIM offices this past week as a gift from EGL. Thank you! As we worked our way through the book of Exodus in Lent under the theme of "Let My People Go," we gave generously to an LCMS effort aimed at helping native Americans find freedom in the Gospel of Jesus Christ. Good job!

CORPUS CHRISTI: Approximately 15 years ago on one of the dozen Higher Things "Dare to be Lutheran" youth gatherings that EGL attended, we had the opportunity to meet a delegation of youth and adults from Scandinavia who were attending that Higher Things gathering with the intention of replicating it for European purposes. A couple of years later CORPUS CHRISTI happened. Not the city in Texas, but the European confessional Lutheran gathering. They meet yearly during the summer to study, worship, and have fun together. The host city changes each year because the young Lutherans come from across Europe, but this summer the

home program is in the the Reformation, Wittenberg, Germany. The program is held mostly in English to accommodate the various languages spoken. This year, Dr Biermann from the St Louis seminary is the featured speaker. One of the biggest differences with the American Higher Things program is that CORPUS CHRISTI focuses on young adults in their 20's rather than the high school age group. Registration is now open. PRO-LIFE REPORT: National Right to Life has released The State of Abortion in the United States, 2024. The eleventh annual edition summarizes key legislative developments on the state and federal level in the first year following the U.S. Supreme Court decision in Dobbs v. Jackson Women's Health Organization, which overturned Roe v. Wade. The report notes that the annual number of abortions was

on the increase in the years leading up to Dobbs. However, more recent numbers show that as many as 89,000 preborn children have been saved since Dobbs due to new protective state laws. The report is available from the National Right to Life Communications
