The regular Fall Voters' Assembly will be on Sunday, October 13 after Service. A full agenda will be forthcoming, but one item to make note of is that a motion will be submitted to approve the new Constitution and Bylaws. There will most likely not be enough members at this meeting to vote, therefore the subsequent Special Voters Assembly will be called on October 20 after Service. APOR is the South Wisconsin District's only crisis pregnancy center. Refuge House is a safe place that provides a loving, nurturing

**HOLY LAND TOUR 2025:** There is something special about meditating on the Scriptures in the very places where the events occurred. Pr Koch of Mt. Zion Lutheran Church in Greenfield will be leading a tour back to the Holy Land next March. Destinations include Bethlehem, Nazareth, Capernaum, the Mount of Beatitudes, Mt.
