


Shall bear the tidings far and full Of liberty and grace,


A message meet for All Saints' Day And Gospel to our race.

Get Out and Vote

November 5 is our next presidential election day. I encourage you to get out and vote. This is both your privilege and duty as a citizen of the United States of America as well as your stewardship as a citizen in the Kingdom of God.

Let me first make it clear that this election is not about the presidential candidates' personalities. The Bible urges us to not be deceived and delude ourselves. So, do your diligent work by gathering much information about our presidential candidates and their VP picks, including their on-the-job competences and performances.

Note that this election is not just about economics, such as record high inflation, or open borders. There is a much more grave concern, i.e., the presidential candidates' ideologies. Christians believe that God has created us in the image of God, with dignity of life. God's 5th command is "You shall not murder" anyone, whether they are in or outside the womb, young or old, depressed, lonely, or not. God has instituted marriage between one man and one woman and desires them not only to become one flesh but also to multiply. [We can of course also thank God for those among us who have the gift of celibacy, which allows them to serve God and their neighbor fully without distraction.] God has entrusted parents with His gifts of children and commanded the children to honor their parents. We should cherish God's gift of life and be content with our immutable sexes assigned at conception.

Moreover, remember that you are not simply voting for a president who appoints thousands of cabinet and departmental officials to carry out his or her ideology-driven policies. Don't be deceived by the cultural Marxist progressivism built on the sinking sand of DIE (diversity, inclusiveness and equity). Miserably failed socialist experiments

in the USSR, China, North Korea, Cuba, etc. have proved that equity regardless of merits doesn't work. After all, why would someone work so hard but receive the same pay as the lazy ones? Stewardship Message: "Moving Forward by Faith"

The theme of our stewardship emphasis this year is "Moving Forward by Faith." It has a nice "ring" to it, but what does it mean to move forward by faith? And what does that have to do with an annual stewardship emphasis?

Hebrews 11:6 says, "And without faith it is impossible to please God, because anyone who comes to him must believe that he exists and that he rewards those who earnestly seek him."

Without faith, it is not possible to please God. It stands to reason then, if we are to please God we need to have faith. Faith is simply taking God at His word. It is believing that God actually exists and that God will keep His promises. It is realizing that God will do what He has committed to do.

This kind of confidence is only available to us through Jesus Christ. He is Alpha and Omega, the beginning and ending of everything, including our faith. Christ is both the source of our faith and the one in whom we place our faith.

How does this relate to giving, and to our annual stewardship emphasis? If faith is simply "taking God at His word" and if God owns everything, then as God's managers and stewards, we are to trust God to provide what we

need and to give direction concerning our giving. To fully realize this, it takes faith. It requires us to accept God's claim that we own nothing, that we are only here temporarily on our way to our eternal home.

The Scriptures are filled with examples of people like that, people like Abraham who looked for a city whose builder and maker was God. People like Noah, who trusted God in the face of seemingly insurmountable obstacles. People like Daniel who placed his full confidence in God even when he was to be the main course for the lions' dinner.

This kind of faith involves every area of our lives, includ-

ing our giving. As you consider the giving of your time, talent and treasures during this year's stewardship emphasis here at Elm Grove Evangelical Lutheran Church, will you do so by faith? Will you ask God to give you the ability to believe His promises and, as He provides, to give by faith?

As you think about using your faith, especially in terms of the commitment God would lead you to make concerning your giving next year, please think about this message:

God honors faith and obedience. He will honor your faith if you will trust Him in a walk of obedience.



Governance Committee Timeline

December, 2022 Ambassadors of Reconciliation Report issued. Recommendation #16 is to consider reviewing and changing the governance model.

February 20, 2023 Motion passed at Voter's Assembly to appoint a committee to review and update the governance model including supporting documents (constitution and bylaws).

June 8, 2023 Committee kick-off meeting held.

July 2023 Began review of our current constitution and bylaws. October 15, 2023 At Voters' Assembly meeting, the committee recommended going to a Single Board Policy Governance model. January 18 and 21, 2024 Town Halls were held to update the

congregation on status of the new constitution and bylaws.

March 3, 2024 Voters' Assembly was updated that the draft constitution was essentially complete and work had started on the

bylaws.

April 28, 2024 Town Hall meeting held with draft constitution and bylaws available for questions and comments.

June 2024 Copy of draft documents sent to Pastor Gugel who is head of the district's committee that will eventually need to approve them.

July 2024 Comments from Pastor Gugel were incorporated into the documents. Work on these draft documents is essentially complete.

August 2024 Work begun on policy manual.

August 8 Proposed constitution and bylaws were sent to the congregation for review.

August 25 and September 5 Town Halls for congregational input on the proposed documents.

October 2024 Expect to have the congregation vote on whether to approve the proposed documents.

At six they took me to Bethesda's Lutheran School where I received an outstanding education starting with Bible History, and studying the catechism, emphasizing memorization until confirmation. There were two classes to each room, which I loved, as I could get a heads up on the upcoming grade. I credit my love of reading, history, writing and so much more to those dedicated teachers. I will always remember the many friendships formed, enriching my life.



A secretary, I had an interesting career at the First Wisconsin National Bank (now US Bank) including the time I leaned on a burglar alarm drawing the attention of a cadre of gendarmes. The Lord sent me a wonderful husband, Ken Smith, who left our family much too soon. However, we were blessed with three sons: Steve, Paul and Bart, all successful grads of Elm Grove Lutheran, and Lutheran High Schools. They have been most supportive, and enhanced our family with fifteen grandchildren and eight great grands. I love living in the country at Twin Springs Farm, Mukwonago, settled in 1836 by Jesse Smith, before Wisconsin became a state.

As a family, we loved camping, fishing, and traveling throughout the grandeur the Lord has given to us all. As a docent for Historic Milwaukee, I reveled in old time history. Gardening not only gave me a hands on education, but I worked with myriads of floral bounty.

Both Ken and I loved singing in our choir, playing handbells, and working with the decorating committee. I was a charter member of the book discussion group. Through the years, there have been other commitments...never chores, but gifts to enhance friendships, to learn, to serve.

The Lord has blessed me with one hundred years of a good life, and good health. Thank you, Lord!
