

to attract targeted FB users to attend a PowerPoint Presentation 'Through the Bible in Two Hours' conducted at your congregation by your pastor. This presentation seeks to show the revealed central theme of the Bible found in each of its sixty-six books."

There will be three opportunities to view the PowerPoint Presentation, which will be led by Pr Skovgaard on the second and third opportunities in mid-February. The founder, Rev. Zwonitzer, will demonstrate the presentation the first time around. At the conclusion of each of the presentations, participants will be invited to enroll in a series of sessions on the key teachings of the Bible, using the Small Catechism as a text. At this point in the program, Pr Senkbeil will help lead the Catechism classes. Under God's blessing, the hope is that the net result will be growth in numbers, but more importantly, the introduction of Jesus to those who are "spiritual but not religious," etc. Please note that the focus and primary attention will be given to those don't know the Bible.

Roman Catholicism? What to make of it nowadays? A lot of time has passed since the Lutheran Reformation. We all have family and friends who belong to Roman Catholic parishes, and often it seems, they sound like Lutherans in many ways. While we can and should give thanks to God for the many points we share in common, there are some important differences we need to address. This new Sunday morning class, following on the heels of the Formula of Concord study, will examine some of the obvious differences that were apparent at the time of the Reformation but also which have developed in the ensuing centuries. Topics will include the Papacy, the view and role of the Virgin Mary, salvation, and the connection between Scripture and Tradition. 

- HOW DID THIS INITIAL CONCEPT COME ABOUT? 1. It came about when Pastor Rod Zwonitzer was ministering at Emmanuel Lutheran, Dearborn. He had wanted to reach out to the unchurched in the congregation's service area. Emmanuel Dearborn was one of the first churches in the area to try Cable TV advertising, and experienced some positive results. Then, in around the 2008-2009 timeframe, Facebook was introduced and offered a fresh, new medium to reach out with the Gospel. Advertising was purchased offering Small Catechism classes and brought an amazingly productive ROI (Return On Investment); Family Units signed up to take a twelve-week study of the Small Catechism leading to Confirmation and Active Member Participation. This led to contemplating how to attract an even larger group of FB users to explore the Bible in a much shorter time than twelve weeks.
- 2. HOW AND WHEN DID THE CURRENT CONCEPT COME ABOUT?

Pastor Zwonitzer moved to help rebrand and upgrade Worldwide KFUO in St. Louis from 2012 to 2015. There he continued to think about the FB approach as a bridge to Small Catechism Class. It was there in St. Louis that he became acquainted with another Lutheran who had a successful Social Media Promotion company and they began brainstorming the possibilities. This led to the Through the Bible in Two Hours Power-Point Presentation. The development continued and a planned launch was targeted for 2019 in St. Louis. However, the launch congregation underwent the COVID-19 pandemic as well as pastoral change, so that delayed the launch until now.

- 3. WHAT LAUNCH PLANS ARE BEING FINALIZED NOW? The necessary steps to launch are being put into place now, including incorporation as a non-profit LLC with 501(c)(3) IRS status which permits "tax deductible" donations. Promotional materials are being developed with a Lutheran Graphics Designer, including FB ads, brochures, landing pages, PowerPoint graphics, etc. Select congregations who have been preliminary informed about this effort are working with us to develop a Launch Schedule.
- 4. WHO DOES THE LEADERSHIP TEAM CONSIST OF? Presently this team consists of: Rev. Dr. Kevin Golden: Professor of Old Testament, Concordia Seminary, St. Louis; Jonathan Koeller:

Founder and Exec. Dir. of Koeller Marketing Solutions, Indianapolis, IN; Rev. Roberto Rojas: Zion Lutheran Church, Winter Garden, FL; Rev. Andrew Wrasman: Oak Road Lutheran Church, Lilburn, GA; Rev. Robert Zagore: Celebration Lutheran Church, Saint Johns, FL; Rev. Rod Zwonitzer, Founder.

5. WHAT IS THE MAIN GOAL OF THROUGH THE BIBLE IN TWO HOURS? To add active members to your fellowship by the power of the Holy Spirit enlightening souls with the Gospel shared via your pastor's Adult Small Catechism Class. This is the goal of an unique "7 Step Process" executing a Facebook Ad Campaign to attract targeted FB users to attend a PowerPoint Presentation "Through the Bible in Two Hours" conducted at your congregation by your pastor. This presentation seeks to show the revealed central theme of the Bible found in each of its sixty-six books.

6. WHAT IS THIS "7 STEP PROCESS?"

In an unique seven step process, the main goal of adding new confirmed members to congregations is targeted. Step One develops a sought after target geographical range which will be the focus of a FaceBook ad campaign. Step Two is the execution of this FB ad campaign on behalf of the congregation whose task is to lead them through Landing Pages which provide the information and motivation (Step Three) to consider registration (Step Four) for the Through the Bible in Two Hours presentation (Step Five). This Two Hour presentation at your church conducted by your Pastor includes "Inviting" the attendees to attend an upcoming Small Catechism class (Step Six) which he will conduct. Step Seven culminates this process with some from the Small Catechism class being confirmed and then entering active congregational membership.

7. WHO ARE THE TARGETED FACEBOOK USERS IN THE AD CAMPAIGN? Primarily we are targeting the unchurched who currently have no religious affiliation. However, the FB campaign will also attract Christians who are interested in learning about what the Confessional Lutheran church holds as the Central Theme of the Bible. Such might be searching for another confessional church body to affiliate with, or explore what the differences in a church bodies' central theme of the Bible is. At some point we will also attempt FB ad concepts which reach out to the dechurched as well.

- 8. WHAT ARE THE EXPECTED RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE CONGREGATION AND THAT OF THROUGH THE **BIBLE IN TWO HOURS?** First, the Congregation desires to Partner in the Gospel with Through the Bible in Two Hours (Philippians 1:5), and perform their assigned responsibilities to execute this Outreach program. These responsibilities include: unified desire to conduct such an Outreach effort; encourage the Congregation to pray for the Lord's blessings on this humble Outreach effort; provide the budget necessary to carry out the Campaign; be prepared to offer and hold the Small Catechism classes that the Outreach effort would provide; be a welcoming fellowship of Christ's Church to these outsiders who would come among them for worship and Bible study. Through the Bible in Two Hours is responsible to conduct all the FB ad campaign (Steps Two – 5) and its subsequent follow -up byway of registering those who wish to sign up for the Small Catechism class and its follow-up efforts. The Congregation will be responsible for Step Six, the Small Catechism Class, as well as Step Seven, the Confirmation and Membership rites.
- 9. HOW MUCH BUDGET DOES THIS EFFORT REQUIRE THE CONGREGATION TO PROVIDE? There are two required budgetary investments that participating congregations must provide. First, in consultation with Through the Bible in Two Hours a minimal agreed upon FB Ad Campaign budget will be developed. Second,

an administrative fee of a minimum amount yet to be determined must be paid to Through the Bible in Two Hours for execution of the Campaign in all its details.

10. WHAT BLESSING CAN ONE EXPECT FROM A CONGREGATION PARTICIPATING IN THIS PART-NERSHIP IN THE GOSPEL?

Truly this Gospel Casting (Matthew 13) provides the Central Theme of the Bible to be revealed and taught to many. The sorting of the fishes into different results along the Seven Step Process is the work of the Triune God. Our current modeling of this Gospel Casting Partnership is based on Flow/Funnel Models (maps of customer journeys in digital marketing) which try and predict what potential outcome participating congregations could expect. These have three different scenarios, and of course, we must all understand that they are no guarantees, since the Holy Spirit must do the heavy lifting to get people to be involved. However, that being said, the modeling is based upon some pretty accurate statistical data, and hopefully will be verified as close to what actual launch results will produce. It has all the potential to be a blessing to Christ's Church in that it has a potentially large Return-On-Investment with a minimal budget! However, all of this is totally dependent on God's blessing. Without His doing, nothing can be accomplished.


bly connect with those around us, in a warm and relaxed environment over a few cold ones and "schnecks",

As the people were in expectation, and all were questioning in their hearts concerning John, whether he might be the Christ, John answered them all, saying, "I baptize you with water, but he who is mightier than I is coming, the strap of whose sandals I am not worthy to untie. His winnowing fork is in his hand, to clear his threshing floor and to gather the wheat into his barn, but the chaff he will burn with unquenchable fire."

So with many other exhortations he preached good news to the people. But Herod the tetrarch, who had been reproved by him for Herodias, his brother's wife, and for all the evil things that Herod had done, added this to them all, that he locked up John in prison.

Now when all the people were baptized, and when Jesus also had been baptized and was praying the heavens were opened, and the Holy Spirit descended on him in bodily form, like a dove; and a voice came from heaven, "You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased." (Luke 3: 15-22)
