A message from President Drabiszczak

Good day everyone,

There were a few important business items that were addressed in the Voters Assembly this past Sunday.

- 1. The Board of Trustees presented a motion to sell the 755-805 properties. Per the constitution:
- A. The voting members present at a Voters' Assembly shall constitute a quorum. However, a majority of all voting members shall be required for a quorum in order to:
 - 1. amend the Constitution or Bylaws of the congregation;
- 2. pass resolutions pertaining to the discipline or dismissal of a called Minister of Religion Ordained;
 - 3. buy, sell, lease or mortgage congregation real estate.

In the absence of a majority of all voting members, the President shall call a new meeting and the voting members present at that meeting shall constitute a quorum.

Since we did not have a majority of voting members present, I am calling a Special Voters Assembly on Sunday, June 1st after the service to address this.

2. The motion presented by Mr. Harmeyer regarding Trinity Lutheran Classical High School was passed unanimously. I have attached it in case you did not get a chance to see it. The Building Strategic Planning

Committee has been meeting with Trinity and we are very excited about this opportunity to bring a school back to EGL. I would encourage you to read the following article regarding the rise of Classical Christian Education in the United States. The \$10 Billion Rise Of Classical Christian Education

Elm Grove Lutheran Church Voters' Assembly May 18, 2025

Motion by Ron Harmeyer

Moved that the Elm Grove Lutheran Church Council take all actions necessary to:

- Appoint an incorporator, pursuant to Wis. Stat. §181.0201, to create and file articles of incorporation, with such articles:
- Providing that the sole purpose of the new corporation being to own and operate Trinity Lutheran Classical High School;
- Conforming to Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code;
- Providing for five initial directors, as appointed by the Church Council; and
- Providing that the name of the corporation shall be "Trinity Lutheran Classical High School, Inc."
- Ensure that, pursuant to Wis. Stat. §181.0205, the initial directors promptly meet to complete the organization of the corporation by appointing officers, adopting bylaws and carrying on any other business brought before the meeting, including but not limited to:
- Obtaining an Employer Identification Number from the Internal Revenue Service;
- Opening a separate checking account for the new corporation;
- Soliciting quotes for all necessary and appropriate insurance for the new corporation;
- Appointing a registered agent; and
- Securing a campus for Trinity Lutheran Classical High School.
- Provide that the new corporation may maintain its registered office, as required by Wis. Stat. §181.0501, at 945 Terrace Dr, Elm Grove, Wisconsin.

Further moved that:

- The Council negotiate with the new corporation for the lease of space to be used as the campus of Trinity Lutheran Classical High School; and
- This motion does not provide or approve any funding for the new corporation or its operations.
