

On July 1 EGL embarked on a new adventure -- policy-based governance, which is different from the Abingdon model of board-based governance that we had employed for decades. Lutheran congregations over the centuries have employed different models depending on their needs and resources. What hasn't changed is the relationship between Pastor and people around Word and Sacrament, but the structure for managing the left-hand kingdom, ie finances, property, school administration, etc, can and has changed. In May under our new constitution and bylaws EGL voters elected a new 7-man Board of Directors to oversee the total life of the congregation and her resources. The seven officers on the Board of Directors are: Ron Harmeyer, James Drabiszczak, Laura Traas, Karla Bessert, Dan Berry, Paul Haut (representing the Committee of Elders), and Mark Ewert. We also elected a 7-man standing Committee of Elders to support and hold accountable the ministry of the Pastors. These seven Elders are: Paul Haut, Rick Wegner, Matt Stroh, Doug Grelk, Eric Thompson, John Wolck, and Bruce Bessert.

In addition to these constitutionally mandated officers, there are appointed committees that the Executive has established for the sake of good order and the needed support. Among these committees you'll find the Finance Committee composed of Christine Wilcox, Tyler Hipke, Emily Ewert, and Sue Wilcox (also our comptroller); the Trustees Committee composed of Jim Olson, Peter Holzwart, and Matt Stroh; and the Evangelism Committee composed of Ben Ewert, Paula Kiefer, Shelly Skovgaard, and Meg Grelk. These committees don't have regular meetings as the old boards did, but rather they oversee various projects, advise and report to the Executive. Much of the same work continues to be done as the former boards did, and volunteers are still needed and appreciated; there simply aren't specific terms of office. The number and description of these appointed committees can vary as needs arise.

CIRCUIT 5 FORUM: Newly elected Circuit 5 Visitor Rev David Paape has called a forum for the congregations of the Circuit to be held at Immanuel Lutheran Church in Brookfield on Sunday afternoon, Sept 21. The congregations in our circuit are Elm Grove Lutheran, Brookfield Lutheran, Blessed Savior in New Berlin, Beautiful Savior in Waukesha, Christ the Life in Waukesha,

Peace in Sussex, Lamb of God in Pewaukee, and Immanuel in Brookfield. Forums are usually called for the sake of a specific item of business. At these meetings each congregation has two votes -- a pastoral and lay vote. This forum has been called to elect Circuit 5 delegates to the Synod convention in Phoenix, Arizona next July 18-23 (sic!). Each circuit throughout the Synod is entitled to elect a pastoral and a lay delegate to represent them at the convention. Alternates will also be elected. None of the delegates or alternates, however, can be from the same congregation. Your EGL voting delegates at the Forum are Pastor Skovgaard and Mrs Laura Traas.

CHRISTIAN NATIONALISM: I encourage you to listen to the moderated debate between Pastor David Ramirez and Concordia Seminary St Louis Professor Dr Joel Biermann during the Monday, August 25, ON THE LINE podcast. It is long, 2 1/2 hours, but is very good for thinking through the relationship between the Christian and the local community or government. This is not an angry, back and forth, no-holds-barred engagement. Both LCMS men stick pretty close to the center of our Lutheran identity but do offer thoughtful reasons for how we engage the world around us, and what exactly that engagement ought to look like.
