Tips to De-Stress this Holiday Season

Not feeling particularly cheery this time of year? You're not alone. Many find that the holidays bring as much stress as they do joy. But there are ways to ease through it.

1. Accept Imperfection

Before you start preparing, acknowledge that things may not go exactly as planned. It's OK if it's not perfect. *Imperfection is healthy and normal*.

2. Don't Lose Sight of What Really Counts

With long lines and nasty traffic, the holidays can get hectic. When overwhelmed by the hustle and bustle, ask yourself:

- If you're frustrated by the long grocery line you're standing in, remember that it is just a long grocery line — nothing more. Don't let it spoil your afternoon.
- Can I use this moment of frustration as an opportunity to reflect? While
 the cashier rings up the customers ahead of you, take inventory of the
 good things that have happened today or the things you are grateful for.
- Connect with someone else in line with a compliment or kind gesture, or notice what's around you with fresh eyes and an open mind.

3. Respond with Kindness

You can't change how others act during the stresses of the holiday season, but you can change how you respond to situations:

- When you encounter a difficult person, consider that the person is suffering, and that's why they're acting this way. It softens your frustration, helps to be more compassionate and reminds ourselves that it's not personal. And remember to be kind to yourself. Let go of negativity.
- Keep in mind that the holidays are especially difficult for those who are alone. See if you can extend an act of kindness to those you know are without family and friends during this time of year.

If things do get tense with someone, take a few deep breaths. Those few breaths can shift things and give you new perspective.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ at Elm Grove Lutheran,

This January, I will be going on a mission trip with a team of UW-Stevens Point students, alumni, and Pastor Andy Weden from Peace Lutheran Campus Center to serve in the small town of Rio Rita, Panama (Central America). The trip will take place January 1-9. While there, we will be serving at the local Lutheran congregation, Iglesia Luterana Jesus Divino Salvador, as we work alongside their Pastor, Rev. Jose Angel and former Panamanian Lutheran Church President, Milton Castillo.

Our time in Panama will involve helping the congregation with several work projects such as painting at the church, making repairs within the Sunday school rooms, and renovating the kitchen just to name a few. Besides the physical projects, we will also be coordinating and leading **V**acation **B**ible **S**chool in the afternoons for the local children. During all the service opportunities, we look forward to learning more about the people and culture of Panama. This will certainly be a wonderful cross-cultural "stretching" experience for me. I am looking forward to growing in my faith through serving and seeing how God is at work in the lives of His people in Panama.

I'd like to ask you to partner with me in two areas: **prayer and financial support.**

Would you begin praying for our team today? Ask that God would bless our attitudes and our preparation. Before we leave, the 13 of us will be putting together a list of prayer concerns. I will send you a copy of those prayers closer to our time of service so that, while we are away, you can pray for me and for our team.

Then, there is the cost of the trip. Each of us is contributing \$1,400 as a personal commitment to reserve our place and for the support of the trip. But the whole trip will cost more when you factor in various needs (project supplies, VBS needs, food, lodging, transportation, etc.) per person. We believe that God will use many of you to assist in providing the necessary funds for this mission. So, whatever the Lord leads you to share will be a blessing for not only our team but also for the people of Panama.

The Birth of Jesus Christ
