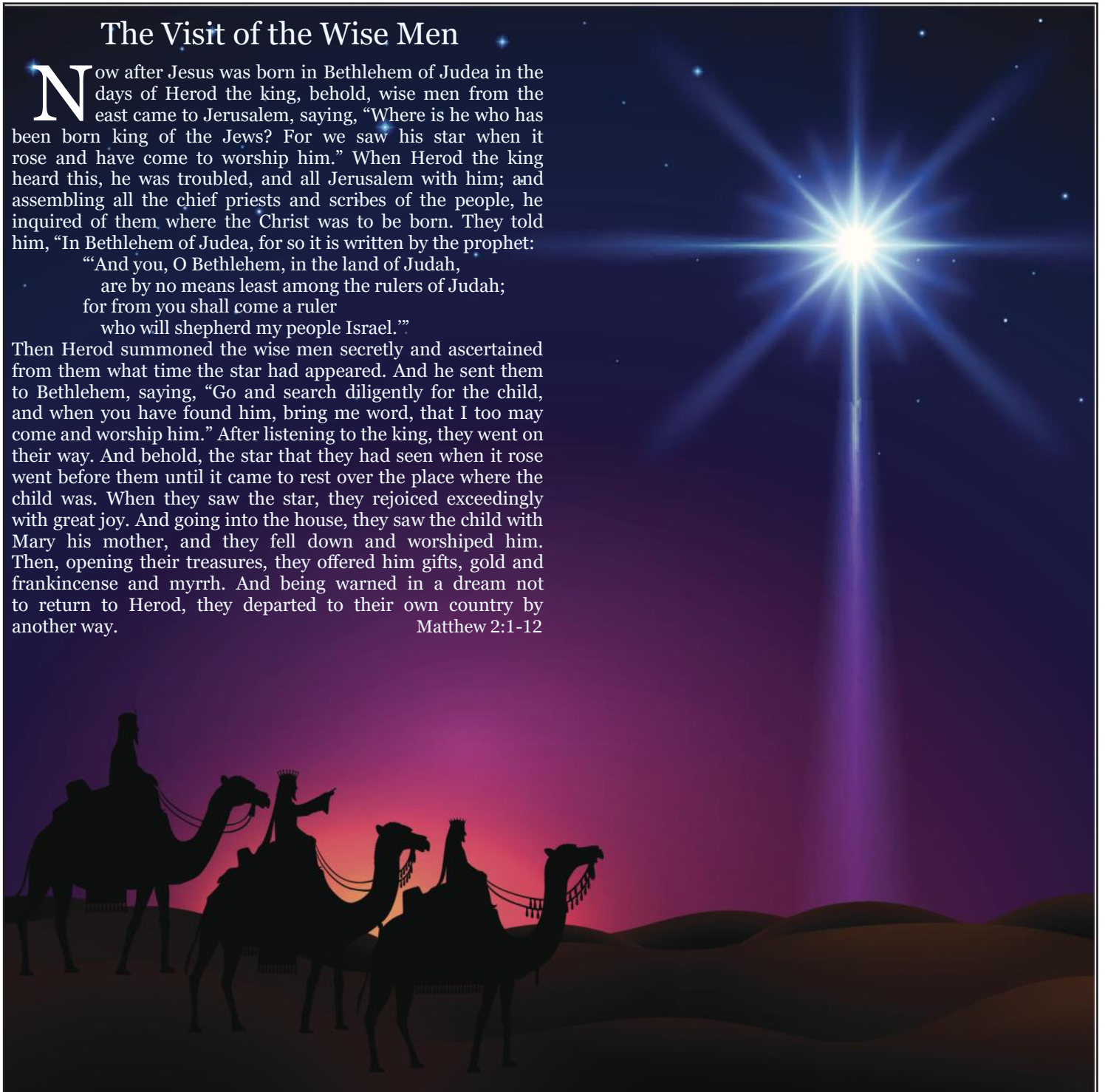
The Visit of the Wise Men

Now after Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea in the days of Herod the king, behold, wise men from the east came to Jerusalem, saying, "Where is he who has been born king of the Jews? From Your Pastor

I hope this *Seasons* newsletter finds you happy and healthy as we embark on a New Year lived under the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ. This is 2026 AD, in the year of our Lord's reign at the right hand of our heavenly Father. This lead article from me will follow a different format, being more like a collection of weekly newsletter blurbs. The EGL Board of Directors and I feel that it's important for the sake of good communication to update you with news that in the past you would have heard at regular voter assemblies. Thus, in future *Seasons* this will simply be entitled "The Executive's Corner," and will vary in size depending on the news to be shared.

EGL Town Hall on Sunday, January 11: Our new policy-based governance model went into effect on July 1, 2025, so January 1 marked the six-month milestone of the EGL Board of Directors. Wanting to keep everyone abreast of news worth sharing, we are holding a townhall meeting, during which the congregation will be updated on events and projects. Please note there won't be anything to vote on, but your input will be solicited.

January 6 Epiphany Service: This year EGL is not holding its own Epiphany Day service; however, an area-wide service is being held at Luther Memorial in Shorewood on Tuesday, January 6, at 6:30 p.m. I am the preacher.

New Memorial Gift Policy: In this issue of *Seasons* you will find a newly adopted Board of Directors policy for the acceptance of donations and memorial gifts. I encourage you to read it. For as many years as I can remember, and probably longer, EGL has operated a very generous attitude to such gifts, allowing members to control the expenditure of money given by others even years after the money was donated to EGL. This new policy is meant to bring us in line with best practices. Please note this does not affect retroactively any accounts we have currently. Everything up to this point is "grandfathered" in.

"Let Your Light Shine" Project: Also in this issue of *Seasons* you will find the details on a new fundraising project entitled "Let Your Light Shine." This project aims to replace/update some existing signage on our property as well as establishing new locations for lit signage. The

details are in this newsletter, but note that the EGL Foundation is supporting this fundraiser to the tune of one \$ for every two \$ raised, so your gifts go even further. The display boards with all the visual aids are able to be seen in the back of the nave.



New and Continuing Bible Studies: *Pastor Skovgaard*

It's a new year; thus, a new opportunity to study God's Word with fellow members at EGL! Carpe Deum! Sunday mornings your Pastors are leading an introduction to the various Old Testament prophets, studying these men chronologically while also putting them in their historical context and unpacking some of the major issues they dealt with. The 7:00 a.m. Tuesday morning men's Bible study is continuing their study of Matthew's Gospel. The 10:00 a.m. Tuesday ladies Bible study led by Pr Teggatz is continuing their study of various Psalms. The 10:00 a.m. Wednesday morning co-ed Bible study led by Pr Skovgaard is jumping into St Paul's magnum opus, Romans, and will begin on Jan 14. The 10:00 a.m. LWML gathering continues to meet on the first Wednesday morning of each month. On Wednesday evening, Jan 21, another ladies study will begin a close look at Esther.

Regular Sunday Morning Worship: Many times in the past you've heard your Pastors talk about the importance of regular worship for your personal spiritual benefit. It's no small thing to receive the gifts of God! However, right now I'd like you to consider the impact your regular worship attendance has on others. For starters, when you dedicate your Sunday morning hours to being in church, you telegraph to your co-workers, your neighbors, and your family what you think is most important. Without having to say a word to them about Christ, by your schedule decisions you are engaged in evangelism. "Let Your Light Shine" Signage Project

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

The Lord has richly blessed our congregation, calling us to be a beacon of His love and truth in our community. As faithful stewards, we are embarking on a project to upgrade and enhance the signage throughout our campus at Elm Grove Lutheran Church. These improvements will:

- Clearly proclaim our identity as a congregation rooted in Christ.
- Welcome visitors and families to worship, learn, and grow in faith.
- Provide helpful direction for all who enter our doors.
- Identify Trinity Lutheran Classical High School.

Our goal is to raise **\$75,000** to cover the costs of replacing the monument sign on Terrace Drive, adding an illuminated monument sign to the Verdant Dr entrance, updating lettering on the West and South faces of our building, directional signage at key locations, updated signage at the School Entrance, long-term warranties, and the necessary electrical work to complete the project. The Elm Grove Lutheran Foundation has generously offered a **matching gift opportunity**. For **every \$2 you give**, the Foundation will contribute **\$1**, up to **\$25,000!** This means your gift will go **50% further** toward our **\$75,000 goal**.

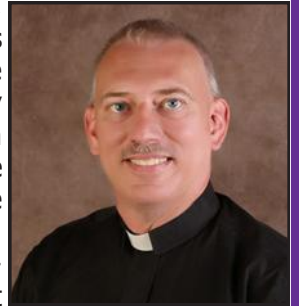
The evening group of LWML will not be meeting in the month of January.

The deadline for registration and for the LWML group rate hotel reservations is January 16, 2026. Since Fond du Lac is relatively close to Milwaukee, you may want to attend the retreat only on Saturday.

The speaker is Rev. Keith GeRue, a U.S. Army Chaplain, who is currently serving as Associate Pastor and Principal at Trinity Lutheran Church and School in Menasha, WI. ELM GROVE EVANGELICAL LUTHERAN CHURCH MEMORIAL GIFT ACCEPTANCE POLICY

The purpose of this congregation is "to proclaim Christ, receiving and sharing His gifts in Word and Sacrament." As a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization, Elm Grove Evangelical Lutheran Church (EGL), relies on charitable contributions to fulfill this purpose. Charitable contributions also help cover its day-to-day operational expenses. Memorial gifts must support and enhance the purpose of EGL. EGL reserves the right to refuse any gift if accepting the memorial is determined to be in conflict with the congregation's purpose, or if, in the sole discretion of the Board of Directors, the gift carries extraneous liabilities that EGL is not able to manage. As an example, a gift of a certain building may involve the need to invest in improvements, pay taxes, deal with tenants, etc.

Every accepted gift will be promptly acknowledged, and donors will be informed of how the memorials will be recognized. Specific requests about acknowledgment will be honored, consistent with EGL's practices and policies. Memorial gifts may be unrestricted or restricted. Gifts that are not restricted will be used toward the general operations as the Board of Directors may determine.

Gifts may be restricted by the donor for a specific program in the Work Plan. The Work Plan is the annual Church budget. If someone wishes their memorial to be restricted to a specific use, they are asked to indicate that preference at the time the gift is given and, if others are also giving memorials, they should also indicate that preference. Restricted memorials may be designated to the following general categories:

- Maintenance
- Music
- Capital improvements

Thereafter, the Executive will determine more specifically how the memorial will be used under the category selected. Please note that only the donor himself may designate a restricted gift. The memorial given by one person cannot later have its designation (restricted or unrestricted) changed by another person, even if by a family member. Likewise, EGL and the EGL Foundation are separate non-profit entities which means that a memorial to one cannot be transferred to the other.

This policy conforms with the best practice of operating non-profit Christian entities. EGL cannot offer tax or legal advice, and the prospective donor is advised to seek his own counsel.

This policy was approved by the Board of Directors on November 13, 2025.

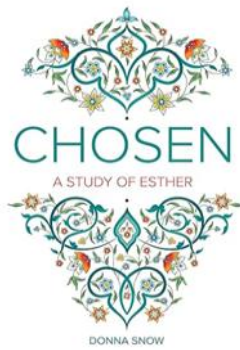
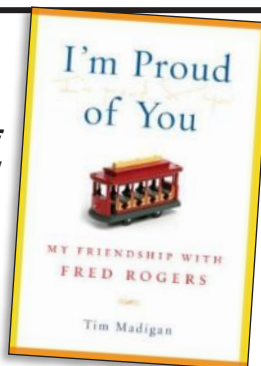
Happy New Year 2026, EGL Guys!

Santa Lucia.*



In celebration of the Feast Day of St. Lucia an authentic kranssekake was served during coffee hour.

One of the victims of the great persecution under the Roman emperor Diocletian, Lucia met her death at Syracuse on the island of Sicily in the year A.D. 304, because of her Christian faith. Known for her charity, “Santa Lucia” (as she is called in Italy) gave away her dowry and remained a virgin until her execution by the sword. The name Lucia means “light,” and, because of that, festivals of light commemorating her became popular throughout Europe, especially in the Scandinavian countries. There her feast day corresponds with the time of year when there is the least amount of daylight. (Collect and Intro from The Treasury of Daily Prayer, Concordia Publishing House)

In medieval Europe before the Gregorian reform of the calendar, St. Lucy’s Day was the shortest day of the year and this day was celebrated especially in Scandinavia where it marked the turning from the long cold nights to the increase in daylight. Swedish communities, including many in America, still have special festivities for this day. In private homes one of the young girls of the household, dressed in white and wearing a crown of lighted candles, awakens the family in the morning and offers them cakes and coffee from a tray. 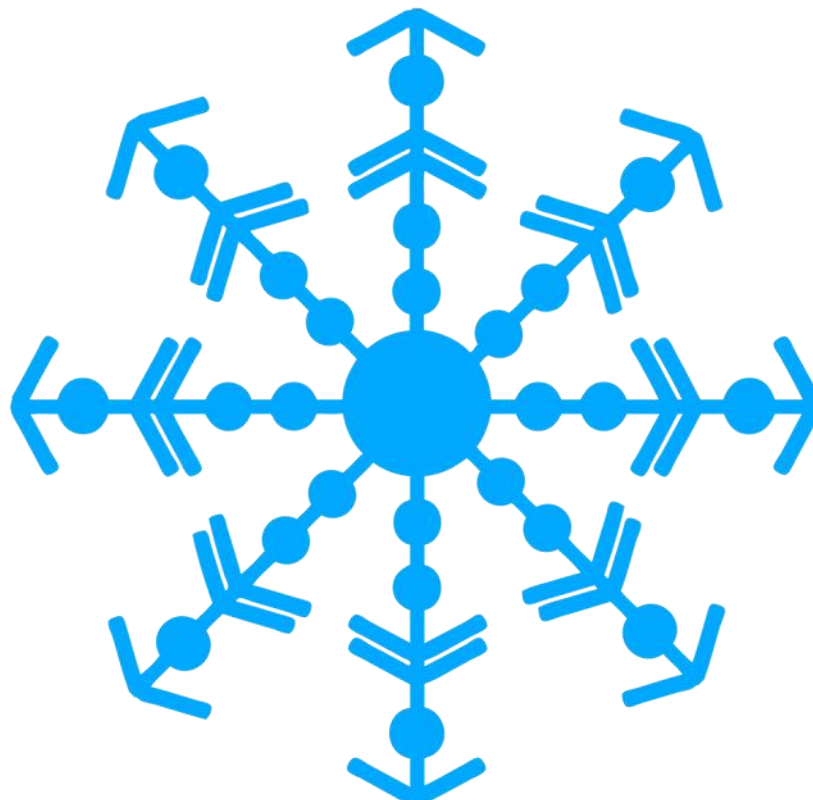
