**ABORTION:** According to the pro-abortion Guttmacher Institute, 1.12 million babies were lost to abortion in 2025. That number is roughly the same as in 2024. When you crunch the numbers, that comes out to roughly 3,000 a day every day of the year. To put that in perspective, that's more than was lost to Islamic terrorism on 9/11. The Guttmacher report documents a decline in interstate travel for abortions but an increase in

telehealth abortions, essentially getting the pill through the mail. These numbers come almost four years after the Supreme Court decision, Dobbs v. Jackson ruling, which returned the topic of abortion to the States. The battle for pre-born life continues.
